The Lady Jays have a winning season

Following in the footsteps of the very successful Jilka was a challenge but coach Rossi and his girls put together a winning season with many exciting mo-

There were eight returning letter winners: Tawni Grriffey, 5"6"; Alec Melvin, 5"7"; Kamilla Jones, 5'8", seniors; Marisa Maddy, 5'2"; Katelyn Engelbert, 5'10"; Darcy Bainter, 5'7"; Bailey Ambrosier, 5'9" and Johnnye Ruder, 5'5", juniors.

Assistant coaches were Joan Bolt and Cheri Brooks.

Raenee Patterson was the student manager.

Griffey returned as the high scorer, averaging 12.5 points per contest and was the only All-Mid-Continent League selection returning.

Returning starters were Griffey, Jones and Engelbert.

"Our three seniors have been awesome leaders," coach Rossi said at the end of the 12-10 season. "It will be tough to replace our seniors but we have a lot of young players coming up. I'm proud of our players. We got a lot better during the season and improved in all areas. Thank you to everyone in the community for your loyal support this season."

Norton opened the season on Friday, Nov. 30 by hosting Goodland in the NCHS Stull Gym. Tawni Griffey was absent for the opener. The Lady Jays lost 49-27. "Both the girls and I were nervous before the game," said coach Rossi. "To our credit, we made a run in the fourth quarter."

Katelyn Engelbert led scoring for Norton with 7 points; Johnnye Ruder and Bailey Ambrosier each added 6 points.

Norton traveled to Goodland for three days the next week to compete in the annual Topside Tip-Off Tournament. On Thursday, Norton defeated Wray, Colo. by a score of 42-32. Norton led from start to finish; Griffey led scoring with 16 points

In Friday's championship semi-finals, Norton played another first round winner, Ottawa. The Lady Jays lost to Ottawa by a score of 72-28. "Ottawa was the best team we've played in a long time," said coach Rossi. Griffey led Norton with 14 points.

The Lady Jays placed third in the tournament with a 35-24 win over Sharon Springs on Sat-

"We played good defense and shot well enough to win," said coach Rossi.

Griffey was leading scorer with 13 points.

Norton stretched their record to 3-2 on Tuesday, Dec. 11 with a 47-28 win at Stockton. Defense was the key as the Lady Jays caused many turnovers and limited the Lady Tigers to just 3 points in the first and third quarters. Griffey led in scoring with

13 points. On Friday, Dec. 14, Norton hosted long-time rival Phillipsburg and extended their win string with an exciting 63-54 double overtime win! Norton started slowly but finished fast. A free throw by Ambrosier with 2.1 seconds left sent the game into a second overtime. Engelbert hit three free throws and a basket in the second overtime and Griffey swished 6 of 6 free throws. Griffey scored 26 points and Ambrosier ended the night with 18 points. "It was a signature win over a team we haven't been beating," said coach Ros-

Norton extended their season record to 5-2 with a 59-26 win over Cambridge in Norton on Tuesday, Dec. 18. Ambrosier scored 16 points and hit a perfect 7 of 7 free throws. It was a good win heading into the holiday break.

The Lady Jays opened the new year on Friday, Jan. 4 with a 51-36 loss at Osborne. Norton

was outshot pretty badly in the game. Griffey scored 14 points and Ambrosier added 13.

The Lady Jays got back on the winning trail on Tuesday, Jan. 8 when they defeated Plainville 52-47 in the NCHS Stull Gym. Norton jumped out to an early lead over an outstanding Lady Cardinal five and held off a late rally to win. Plainville was coming off a tournament title performance. Griffey scored 15

On Friday, Jan. 11, Norton traveled to WaKeeney. The Lady Jays didn't shoot as well as Trego but took more shots and outrebounded the Lady Golden Eagles to win 51-40 and extend their record to 7-3. Griffey led with 14 points.

The annual Mid-Continent League Tournament opened on Tuesday, Jan. 15 and No.4 seeded Norton hosted No.5 seed Plainville in the NCHS Stull Gym. Again, Plainville rallied in the fourth quarter but Norton still won 49-41. Ambrosier led Norton with 15 points.

On Friday, Jan. 18, Norton advanced to the tournament semifinals in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays. The Lady Jays played No.1 seed and unbeaten Smith Center. Norton played well and led 30-25 after three quarters but the Lady Red, led by Sydney Benoit, rallied for a 41-36 win. Griffey scored 21 points. Smith Center continued on to win their first ever State Basketball Championship, ending the season with a 24-2 re-

On Saturday, Norton played No.3 seed Osborne and lost 44-31 to place fourth. "They were coach Rossi. physical and much more aggressive," said coach Rossi.

Ellis won the league tournament championship by a score of 73-63 over Smith Center.

Griffey was leading free throw shooter, hitting 81 percent of her charity tosses. Alec Melvin hit 61 percent of her free throws and Kamilla Jones swished 53 percent of her charity throws. Ambrosier led Norton in field

goal percentage, hitting 58 percent of her attempts.

Engelbert was leading rebounder with 151 total caroms or an average of 6.9 boards per game. Ambrosier was close behind with 143 total rebounds and an average of 6.5 per contest. Griffey pulled down 75 rebounds or 3.6 per game.

Griffey was steals leader with 49 for the season or an average of 2.3 per game. She was followed by Engelbert, 27; Ambrosier, 25, Jones 23; Melvin 17.

Griffey was also offensive assists leader with 73 total, or 3.5 per contest. Jones had 20 assists, Ruder 18 and Engelbert 14.
