Freshman Lexi Voss won the discus with a throw of 88' and placed runner-up in the shot put with a heave of 28'10.5".

Freshman Hanna Brooks medaled in three events individually. She won the long jump with a leap of 13'8.25", finished third in the triple jump with a distance of 27'8.5" and placed fifth in the 100 meter dash in 15.20.

Hanna won another gold medal as a member of the first place 4 x 400 meter relay team, which was clocked in 5:04.20. Running with her were freshmen Peyton Renner, Casey Ambrosier and Cayanna Campbell.

Ambrosier also earned a second gold medal with a first place in the 800 meter run with a clocking of 2:59.72, finished runner-up in the long jump with a leap of 13'8" and placed runner-up in the triple jump with a distance of 29'1".

Freshman Raenee Patterson was the other gold medal winner for the Lady Jays. She was first in the 1600 meter run with a time of 7:01.71.

Campbell also placed third in the 100 meter dash in 14.98.

Junior Sophie Manegold also competed. She threw the discus 46'10" for 19th best and heaved the shot 17'8.5" for 21st.
