# Many honored at Norton Wrestling Banquet

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Following the potluck meal at the 2012-13 Norton Community High School Wrestling Banquet, head coach Bill Johnson and his assistant coaches spoke to the large crowd and presented awards.

"Most Outstanding The Wrestler" award, the most prestigious of all, was awarded for the second year to senior John Risewick, who won the state championship and compiled an impressive season record of 44-3. He led his team in five of 10 statistical categories. Risewick was the leader in team points with 197, most takedowns, 71; most two-point near falls, 27; most major decisions, 7 and most technical falls, 5.

Receiving the "Coach Durham" award was Cody Ellis. The award is based on hard work, sportsmanship, academics and good citizenship. Cody also won the senior class academic award with a 3.62 grade point average. He was also honored by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association with a first team academic award.

John Risewick received honorable mention among the academic awards from the KWCA. The entire Norton team also received fourth place in the state in Class 3-2-1A academically from the KWCA.

Other classroom "Academic Award" winners and their grade point averages were: junior

Branson Addington, 3.51; sophomore Derek Rowh, 3.47 and freshmen Kyle Bell and Weston Erbert, 4.0.

Cody Ellis was one of three wrestlers named "Most Improved Wrestlers of the Year". The others receiving the award were junior Ethan Ross and senior Lucas Engel.

The "Most Promising Freshman" award was won by Gavin Lively and the "Outstanding Sophomore" award went to Caysean Campbell and Jared Tallent.

Skylar Johnson was named the "Outstanding JV Wrestler" and Derek Rowh was the winner of the "Most Improved JV Wrestler" award.

The "Underdog Match of the Year" award went to Lucas Engel in honor of all his State Tournament matches. Lucas Engel also received the "Most Exciting Match of the Year" award for his win over the Sylvan Grove wrestler in the Regional Tournament.

The "Key Match of the Year" award went to Jared Tallent for his 13-5 major decision over Macen Shull, Colby and to Caysean Campbell for his pin of Rogers, Smith Center, in the Regional Tournament.

The "Fan of the Year" award went to Rick Green.

Winners of the varsity statistical awards, in addition to Risewick's, were: Alec Hager, most reversals, 27; Jared Tallent, most 3 point near falls, 24; Branson Addington, most decisions, 12;

Ethan Ross, most falls, 19; Caysean Campbell, fastest fall, 6 seconds.
