# Lady Jays take runner-up

Phillipsburg was the girls champion with 101 points and the Lady Jays were just four points behind them with 97. Ellis placed third with 71.5 points, followed by Smith Center, 70; Osborne, 69; Trego Community, 48; Plainville, 48; Hill City, 43.5; Stockton, 6.

Phillipsburg also won the boys title with 180 points, followed by Plainville, 90; Smith Center, 73; Ellis, 57; Norton, 55; Osborne, 53; Hill City, 26; Stockton, 24.

Junior Darcy Bainter scored points in both distance races. She placed runner-up in the 3200 meter run with a time of 13:15.88 and fourth in the 1600 meter run in 6:06.68.

Freshman Molly Maddy finished fourth in the 3200 meter run in 13:43.58.

Freshman Peyton Renner placed fourth in the triple jump with a 31' distance.

Kamilla Jones was fifth in the long jump with a leap of 14'10.75".

"Once again we were able to equal our season-best team score but, against the high-quality teams in the Mid-Continent League this season, our overall placing was not what we had hoped coming into the tournament," said Norton head golf coach David Stover.

"Once again, we had to battle the elements and I think we did a good job of handling that. What we must do from here on out is put together an entire round, not just good nine-hole scores.

"I was especially happy for John Risewick, stepping up with a career-low round to earn individual medalist honors. We have had many personal bests in recent tournaments but, for us to have success in the post season, we must have multiple golfers have that type of success on the same day and we are very capable of achieving that."

Phillipsburg won the league championship with a 323, followed by Plainville, 329; Ellis, 329; Trego Community, 329; Norton, 342; Stockton, 355; Smith Center, 359; Osborne, 391; Hill City, 400.
