Development committee updates council

Representatives of the Downtown Development Committee, Kristine Knapp and Joslyn Henson, presented the committee's plan for the downtown area to the Norton City Council during its regular meeting on Wednesday.

The committee has been given \$25,000 in Hansen Foundation funds for the project, and its first priority will be the four pods at the intersection of Main and State streets. If more money or grants is received for this project, the Development Committee could possibly do all eight pods in downtown.

The committee said the curb and gutter work will take up the majority of its budget. The committee also discussed several decorative ideas for the pods, including stamping of the concrete, flower pots on each corner, and possibly a sculpture if money is donated for it. Decorative stop signs with the street names and decorative light poles are also being considered.
