Another successful track season for the Lady Jays

The Lady Jays' season highlights were: first, Smith Center JV Meet; second, Norton Invitational; third, Smith Center Redmen Relays; eighth, Trego Freshman/Sophomore Meet; fourth, Plainville Invitational; fourth, Phillipsburg Invitational; third, Goldsmith Relays (Trego); second, Oberlin Invitational; fifth, Russell Relays; 11th, Hill City Invitational; second, Mid-Continent League Championships in Hill City; fifth, 3A Regional Championships in Holcomb; 14th, 3A State Championships in Wichita.

High point scorer for the Norton girls for the third straight year was senior Alec Melvin with 196 points.

Review of season

On Monday, April 1, Norton took mostly freshmen to the Smith Center JV Track Meet and won the championship with 130 points. Russell was runner-up with 87. Freshman Molly Maddy placed first in the 3200 meter run with a time of 14:02.13 and also won the gold in the pole vault with a 7' clearance. Freshman Lexi Voss won the discus with a throw of 88' and placed runner-up in the shot with a heave of 28'10.5". Freshman Hanna Brooks medaled in three events. She won the long jump with a leap of 13'8.25", placed third in the triple jump with a distance of 27'8.5" and fifth in the 100 meter dash in 15.20. Norton's 4 x 400 meter relay team of freshman Peyton Renner, freshman Casey Ambrosier, freshman Cayanna Campbell and Brooks placed first in 5:04.20. Renner won the triple jump with a distance of 30'5", was third in the long jump at 13'5.25" and third in the pole vault at 6'6". Casey Ambrosier earned a second gold medal in the 800 meter run in 2:59.72, placed runner-up in the long jump at 13'8" and runner-up in the triple jump at 29'1". Freshman Raenee Patterson won the 1600 meter run with a time of 7:01.71. Campbell placed third

in the 100 meter dash in 14.98. The Norton Invitational was held on Friday, April 15 and Norton tied with Phillipsburg for runner-up with 94 points. Colby won the championship with 121 points, Oberlin scored 76 and Northern Valley 44. Four throwers scored 33 points for Norton.
