Norton was very competitive in the first game and actually had more hits and fewer strike outs than Colby despite the loss.

Norton took a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning when Mickey Hahn was hit by a pitch and walked, Andrew Ellis got on base on a fielder's choice, Dalton Miller got on base on an error and Trever Lewis singled. Ellis and Miler both scored.

The Blue Jays scored two runs in the bottom of the third to narrow the Colby lead to 5-3. Jordan Dole walked, Hahn got on base on a fielder's choice, Miller got on base via an error and Lewis walked. Dole and Hahn both scored.

Colby tallied six big runs in the top of the fourth to lead 11-3. Norton got one run in the bottom of the inning when Nickell reached base on an error and Dole drove him home with a single.

Colby added one more run in the top of the seventh. Norton was unable to mount a rally,


