mstephens@nwkansas.com Superintendent Greg Mann present-ed the proposed 2013-14 budget to the Board of Education, U.S.D. 211, at its Board of Education, U.S.D. 211, at its regular meeting on Monday at the Alice Tweed Center. The Board approved the budget for publication with an increase in the capital outlay mill levy to five mills and an increase in the Local Option Budget to 21.4 mills. The budget was approved by a 5-1 vote, with Bill Jones voting no. Steve Berry requested that the minutes reflect that the increases are necessary due to the fact that the Kansas State Legislature is not appropriating enough funds to pay for appropriating enough funds to pay for all state aid owed to schools according to state statutes.
