## Bus routes a concern for commissioners

Norton County wants to keep its students safe and the county commissioners and road and bridge department are willing, with a little help from a local resident, to make sure the buses have the best routes they can provide.

Road and Bridge Foreman Floyd Richard and office manager Becky Wilson came to the Aug. 19 commissioner's meeting with Norton School District Transportation Director Jim Jackson and USD 211 Superintendent Greg Mann to talk about a problem bus route. Jason McKenna, a parent on the bus route, also attended the meeting.

Mr. Jackson told the commissioners that he has a new bus route near Mr. McKenna's place. To pick up children

on the new route, he said, the bus needs to go to Road 11 and backtrack. Road 12, which is less hilly, has some gravel on it, he said, up to an oil well site. However, after that the road is just dirt.

He said that the bus is picking up children in Clayton at 7 a.m. now and if the bus has to start backtracking, the Clayton students will have to start getting on it at 6:30 a.m., and that's just too early. The state wants no one on a bus for more than an hour, he said, and the school district agrees with that and tries to follow that guideline.

If Road 12 gets gravel on the additional length, it will help make the ride safer and more comfortable for the driver and children, Mr. Jackson indicated.

"Those buses go down a dirt road and the kids can't breath on it," Mr. Jackson said of the dust that boils up

into the vehicle.

The commissioners agreed that help is needed.

"Let's take care of it," Commissioner R.A. Peterson said.

The commissioners asked if that is the only road that is a problem for the buses and Mr. Jackson said that he had had a meeting with his drivers and, aside from some washboard problems, everyone is pretty happy with the state of the roads.

"We don't expect you to gravel the whole county," he said, adding that the bus could still use Road 11 if it became necessary because of snow drifting in the winter.

"Safety first," Mr. Jackson said. "Convenience second."

Mr. McKenna offered to haul gravel for at least part of the road if the county

# Vintage sprint car will be retired Sunday

dpaxton@nwkansas.com This weekend MBM Motorsports and the Norton Elmwood Park Racing Association will host the Twelfth Annual Vintage Car Races in memory of lifelong resident and vintage car race enthusiast, Don McMullen. Cars from Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado dating back to the 1930's, 40's and 50's will be put into action both Saturday and Sunday nights at the Elmwood Park Speedway. The URSS 305, IMCA Non-sanctioned winged sprints and IMCA stock cars with vintage and antique race cars will take the track at 7 p.m. Saturday and 6 p.m. on Sunday.

This race is held every Labor Day

weekend but this year it will be the Don McMullen Memorial race. You may ask why if you didn't know Don but those who did certainly will understand why. Twelve years ago McMullen and Jerry Bantam started the vintage races at Elmwood Park Speedway. Car number 81, the 50 plus year old sprint car that was seen on the track every year, will be retired in honor of Don. Some of Don's family members will drive the car on Saturday but on Sunday it will take its last lap.

This car, as well as the two gentlemen have a long racing history together. No. 81 was the first rear engine mounted car in the United States originally built (Retires - Continued on Page 5)
