# Home filled with rich history on homes tour

old and a little new," Reva Benien stated. She is the proprietor of The Prairie Inn at Lathrop House located at 602 N. First in Norton and will be on this year's Norton County Arts Council Homes Tour on September 22.

Reva bought the two and a half story home in April of this year from Sara and Lanny Davis. She plans on redoing it and making it into a bed and breakfast. Her initial plan was to be ready by May or June and now it is looking like it might be more like January, 2014. There is a lot of work that she plans on completing before opening. "It was like divine intervention that I was able to purchase one of the two houses currently for sale in Norton with such a rich history." Reva stated.

The home was built in 1915 for Dr. William Lathrop, a surgeon, and his wife Amy. Ship laborers built the frame constructed home in the mission style. It remained in the Lathrop family for years and years. After the Lathrops divorced in 1928, Mrs. Lathrop, Amy turned it into a boarding house. Amy did remarry and later died in 1969 where Mr. Lathrop died in 1942. Joe and Clair Herman owned the home for a bit but then in 1973 Sara and Lanny Davis purchased the home and have lived in it up until they sold the large home to Ms. Benien.

Reva said that it is a work in progress. She was hunting for some-
