

# Huskies have big win over Triplains

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 The Northern Valley Huskies bounced back from their season opening loss, with a big 56-22 win over the Triplains/Brewster Titans in Alma on Friday, Sept. 13/

Quarterback Hunter Chandler opened the scoring with a 27 yard strike to Matt Stutsman. Chandler scored the conversion and it was quickly, 8-0 Huskies. A minute and 36 seconds later, Phillip Bryant rumbled into the end zone on a 25 yard run. Jordan Baird scored the conversion, 16-0 Huskies. With time running out in the first quarter,

Baird extended the Huskies lead with a 3 yard touchdown run, 22-0 Huskies.

In the second quarter, Bryant would score twice. The first touchdown was a 12 yard run, Chandler passed to Cole for the 2-point conversion, making it 30-0 Huskies. The second time, Bryant cut through the Titans defense for 39 yards, and the Huskies were up 36-0.

Triplains/Brewster would get on the board with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jace Jorgensen, but that was quickly erased, with time running out in the half Chandler hit Baird for a 50 yard touchdown pass giving

the Huskies a commanding 42-8 lead going into halftime.

In the third quarter, Chandler connected again with Baird, 36 yards in all on the touchdown pass and the Huskies led 50-8.

In the fourth quarter, the Titans scored twice but never threatened the Huskies lead. Phillip Rupp scored on a 77 yard kickoff return to seal a big 56-22 win over the Titans.

**Coach's Comments**  
 "We showed considerable improvement from week one to week two. We were more aggressive on defense and did a better job of blocking on offense," said head coach Chuck

Fessenden. "Jordan (Baird) and Phillip Bryant had several nice runs. Hunter (Chandler) threw the ball much better this week. Phillip Rupp had a real nice kick-off return. We were able to get some valuable playing time for our JV kids. We need to continue to improve with Hill City on the schedule next week." said head coach Chuck Fessenden.

# Junior Huskies lose season opener at home

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 The Northern Valley Junior High Huskies lost their season and home opener to the Osborne Bullpups on Thursday, Sept. 5 in Long Island, 58-28.

In the first quarter, the Huskies jumped out to an early lead. Caden Kinderknecht connected with Ross Cole on a 24 yard touchdown pass and Briely Yocum scored the 2-point conversion, 8-0 Huskies.

Shortly thereafter, Yocum would find the end zone on a six yard run and score the 2-point conversion as well, and the Huskies appeared to be in good form with a 16-0 lead.

However, the Huskies defense had no answer for the Bullpups Denton Schurr. He would score three unanswered touchdowns on runs of 40 yards, 43 yards, 12 yards, respectively, giving the Bullpups a 20-16 lead at halftime.

In the third quarter, Osborne padded its lead. Andres Faundez scored on the Huskies defense from 24 yards out, and then Schurr added on with a five yard touchdown run. The Huskies trailed by 18 points going to the fourth quarter.

Kinderknecht cut the lead to 12 points with a 1 yard touchdown, but Schurr couldn't be stopped, scoring two more

touchdowns on runs of 5 and 63 yards, giving the Bullpups a commanding 50-22 lead.

Despite being down 28 points the Huskies continued to battle, however. Nick Stutsman scored on an 11 yard run, cutting the Bullpups lead to 50-28.

The Bullpups would add a late score on Roxton Brown's 12 yard touchdown run, giving Osborne an impressive 58-28 victory over the Huskies at home.

The key to the Bullpups victory was the inability of the Huskies defense to stop Denton Schurr, who accounted for six touchdowns and five 2-point conversions.

Coach Jim Cole's Comments- "We had trouble tackling their speedy tailback the whole game. Our offense moved the ball most of the night both on the ground and through the air. Our boys played hard and we will work on our open field tackling next week in practice."

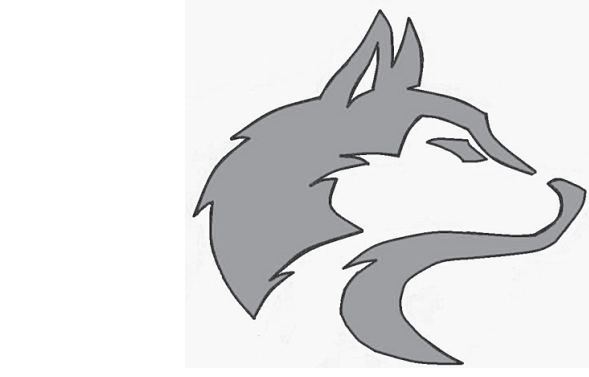

**NOTICE TO AIRPORT CONSULTANTS**  
 The Norton City/County Airport Board is hereby soliciting statements of qualifications and experience from airport consultants for projects at the Norton Municipal Airport. Subject to receipt of Federal funding, these projects may include the following:

1. Taxiway Construction and Lighting
2. Runway Extension and Widening
3. Pavement Rehabilitation
4. Airfield Lighting Improvements
5. Apron Expansion
6. Hangars and Other Buildings
7. Access Road and Parking Lot Improvements
8. Associated work items and general airport engineering

The required services include, but are not limited to, engineering services for preliminary, design, bidding and construction phases including incidental special services for the above listed projects funded under the FAA Airport Improvement Program.

A qualification based selection process conforming to FAA Advisory Circular 150/5100-14d will be utilized to select the most qualified firm. Fee information will not be considered in the selection process and must not be submitted with the statement of qualifications.

Selection Criteria will include: Recent experience in airport projects, capability to perform all aspects of project, reputation, ability to meet schedules within budget, quality of previous airport projects undertaken, interest shown, and consultant qualifications.

Fees will be negotiated for projects as federal funds become available. Prospective consultants are advised that applied overhead rates must be in accordance with the cost principals established within Federal Regulation 48 CFR Part 31, Contract Cost Principles and Procedures. The successful firm will be required to submit a copy of their current overhead rate audit certification.
