## Rotary BB Gun Team holds first meeting

Approximately 40 interested girls and boys and their parents attended the informational meeting for the 2013-14 Norton County Rotary BB Gun Team which was held on Monday evening in the former Sidles Building at the corner of State and Washington in Norton.

This is a new headquarters for the team since the former BB Gun Museum on U.S Highway 36 has been closed.

The BB Gun Museum contained trophies, medals, newspaper articles and other memorabilia of the Norton shooting education program. All historical items from the former museum have been saved and will be displayed at a future time.

Monday's meeting got underway with an orientation by second year head coach Jeff Elliott so those who are new to the program would have a good understanding of objectives as well as the storied history of the program in Norton.

Following Jeff's presentation, potential shooters were allowed to fire BB guns from the prone position, one of four used in competition.

Girls and boys ages 8 to 14 are eligible to compete in marksmanship shoots after completing classroom work during the season.

"I was very happy with the turnout for the meeting," said coach Elliott. 'We should have some good new shooters. Several were shooting well right out of the gate.

"We answered all the questions from parents and stressed that it will be a long season but every shooter will be allowed to shoot in competition. We like to see dedication in our shooters and, hopefully, this will lead to qualifying to shoot in the nationals in Rogers,

"We are a 4-H project club so will be shooting in some 4-H shoots as well.

"It's hard work but also a lot of fun. "The most important thing is that we
