## Huskies end season in victory over Bulldogs

Senior Jordan Baird set the tone with a dominating 1st quarter performance, scoring four touchdowns. Baird scored on runs of 29, 73, 50 and 17 yards. The Bulldogs managed to get on the board on a Shane Ryburn 1 yard run, but the Huskies had a commanding lead going into the second quarter, 30-6.

Senior Hunter Chandler picked up where Baird left off, scoring on long runs of 46 and 32 yards. Chandler also threw a 33 yard touchdown pass to Baird as time expired in the first half. The Huskies took a 40 point lead, 52-12, into halftime.

The game ended early in the third quarter, via the 45-point rule, when Drake Shearer scored from six yards out, giving the Huskies a big 58-12 victory over the Bulldogs.

Coach's comments-

"We were able to move the ball with relative ease. We did not play very well defensively early in the game," said head coach Chuck Fessenden. "However, we came around as the game wore on. Jordan Baird and Hunter Chandler each had big games. Jordan with 181 yards and Hunter with 104. Hunter and Jordan were also able to hook up on a touchdown pass to end the half. Our second team came in at the start of the third quarter and put together a nice drive to end the game. This game was a good way for us to end the season on. The season did not go quite as we had

hoped. A lack of depth and size at some of the positions made it tough to compete with some of the teams on our schedule. The loss of Ian Vincent to injury was a critical blow. We will miss Ian, Hunter, and Jordan next year. They were important pieces on our team over the past four years."

The Bluejays opened up the game with a 63 yard touchdown run by Jace Ruder. Ruder scored the PAT as well, and it was quickly 8-0, Bluejays.

"This was another outstanding game by our defense. On the very first play of scrimmage, Smith Center broke an 82 yard run in which our defense didn't give up on the play. We were able to pursue the ball carrier and tackle him on the eight yard line. The next four plays

our defense "stiffened" up and held them out of the end zone. We talked to the defense before game time about "bending but don't break." With the type of offense Smith Center runs they were going to have some big plays, and they try to wear you down mentally. When they bust a big play you have to put it behind you, that play is done! When we kept them out of the end zone it gave our defense great confidence. The defense has done outstanding towards the end of the season."

"We finished the year with 5-2 record and a second place finish in the MCEL. The athletic gains from the beginning of the year until now were tremendous! This was a very hard working group and it shows on the field. I would like to thank my assistant coaches; Bill Johnson, Don Burge, and Buzz Palmer for their work with the young men."
