Ordinance on pets addressed at council

Municipal Court Judge Jerry Hawks attended the City Council meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 6 to express his concerns about Ordinance #1651, amending Chapter 2, Article 2 of the City Code, amending the animal registration, licensing, visiting animals, nuisance and impoundment ordinances within the City.

Judge Hawks said it is dangerous for cats to wear a tight collar, because they can get caught up and hang themselves.

the ordinance address cats that aren't neutered, rather than all cats, because the people who go to the trouble and expense of having their cats spayed or neutered take care of them properly. Hawks said he thinks the City should control feral cats and un-neutered breeding cats, and eliminate people from feeding the feral cats. He stated that as a Municipal Judge, he sees the cat aspect of the ordinance as difficult to work with.

Judge Hawks also informed the
