## Marketplace deadline extended

The new deadline in the Health Insurance Marketplace has been extended from December 15 to December 23 to have coverage beginning January 1. This extension is due to the many difficulties people have experienced so far trying to enroll in marketplace plans. While this extra eight days will allow more people to enroll, consumers need to be aware that this is also a very short turn around time to receive information from insurance companies in

For coverage beginning after January 1, consumers are allowed to purchase marketplace plans until March 31, 2014 without facing a tax penalty.

With the promise of a functioning website at the end of Healthcare.gov, November, although not functioning perfectly, has made significant im-

provements over the last month. Rates and plan details can now be accessed before creating an account or entering any personal information allowing consumers to better compare their

Comparing rates and plans, in the marketplace and out, will be critical for consumers to make educated decisions about what kind of healthcare they need and also what they can afford. If you are experiencing problems enrolling online, you can also enroll over the phone by calling 1-800-318-2596.

Deadlines are also not the only thing that has changed in healthcare over the last month. The federal government is allowing states to decide if they want to allow people to keep non-compliant plans for one more year because of the problems people are having getting enrolled in the marketplace. Kansas is allowing insurers to do this if they choose to.

This means you may be receiving a letter in the mail saying your plan will continue into this coming year. If your plan was canceled, call your insurance company to see if they will still be offering your plan for one more year.

However, consumers still need to compare their current plans to other private plans and marketplace plans to find what will best suit their needs. They will also need to keep in mind that tax credits will only be available in the marketplace. To find out if you are eligible for a tax credit, use the calculator on insureks.org.


