Norton takes runner up in Durham tourney

Bill Johnon, head coach of the Norton Community High School wrestling team, knew when he invited Garden City to compete in the 49th annual J.R. Durham Wrestling Tournament he was inviting the top ranked team in the state and they proved the accuracy of their rating.

The defending Class 6A state champion Buffaloes dominated the team race by scoring 187 points.

The Norton Blue Jays, who have won the tournament nine of the last ten years, placed runnerup with 149.5 points, 19 more than last year when they won the championship.

Each year the tournament honors former NCHS wrestling coach J.R. "Jake" Durham and former state medalists for Norton.

Oakley placed a distant third with 87 points, followed by Cozad, 85; Beloit, 75; McCook, 74; Smith Center, 70; Ulysses, 67.5; Atwood, 60.5; Scott City, 46.5; Cimarron, 40; Hays Thomas More Prep, 33.5; Hoxie, 29; Norton JV, 14; Greeley County, 4.

Garden City had five champions and Norton had five second places and no champions.

Placing runner-up for Norton were Caysean Campbell, 106; Kade Unterseher, 113; Ethan Ross, 120; Jared Tallent, 145 and Kendall Miller, 160.

Placing third in their weight classes were Skylar Johnson, 106; Alec Hager, 138; Cole Renner, 170 and Jacob Green, 220.

Mike Kasson, 152, placed fourth and Jordan Dole, 195, finished fifth.

Trenton Wright, 126 and Toby Nickell, 132, did not place.

Norton was open at 182 and 285.

Norton had a 25-19 won-loss record and a 14-6 pin ratio.

Tevin Briscoe, 138 pounder from Garden City, was voted the "Outstanding Wrestler" of the tournament.

Coach's comments


"I thought it would be a two-team race for the championship and it turned out to be just that," said coach Johnson.

"It was our first tournament back from the holiday and our condition was not very good.

"We weren't real consistent with good technique but it's hard to be on top of your technique when your tongue is hanging out. In addition to working on conditioning, our second priority will be to continue to work on more skills, more moves, more ways to ride people, etc. We need more tools in our tool box, so to speak."

Trojans win both games


