

Kansas Shrine Bowl players chosen

The names of high school senior football players who will be invited to play in the 41st annual 2014 Kansas Shrine Bowl All-Star Football Game have been announced by the Kansas Shrine Bowl board of directors.

This prestigious game between the East and West all-stars will be played in Carney Smith Stadium at Pittsburg State University on July 26 at 7 p.m.

A total of 34 players for the East and 34 players for the West have been chosen by vote of the Kansas news media and Shrine Bowl coaching staff.

Selection to play in this game has become one of the most sought after and prestigious honors a Kansas high school football player can be awarded. Only 68 young men are invited to play in this game each year from the entire state of Kansas. Rules state that only one player from each school can participate.

In addition to bringing honor and recognition to the participants and their schools, the Shrine Bowl donates all net profits, over two million dollars so far, to the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Kansas children are treated

in the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children absolutely free, regardless of their race, religion, nationality or relationship to a Shriner.

The hospitals provide expert, no-cost orthopedic and burn care treatment to children under 18.

The Huskies won this game with a dominating first half. Junior Matt Stutsman led the charge with eight points in the first quarter. The Trojans struggled from the field and trailed 16-8.

In the second quarter, senior Hunter Chandler scored six of the Huskies 14 points. The Trojans offensive woes continued, as they managed only five points in the quarter, all from Chad Becker, which gave the Huskies a commanding 17 point lead over the Trojans at the break.
