Tournament of Champions results

Norton Community High School was the smallest enrollment school competing in the prestigious 51st annual Newton Wrestling Tournament of Champions in Newton last Friday and Saturday but the Blue Jays' partial team proved once again that they were capable of wrestling with the larger schools in the Sunflower State.

Coach Bill Johnson entered just 11 wrestlers in the 14 weight classes and the Blue Jays placed 15th out of 27 teams.

Norton, the smallest school to ever win this tough tournament, also finished 15th last season.

Norton is the defending Class 3-2-1A state champion and is currently ranked No.1 in the state.

Grand Island, Neb., who entered the tournament for the first time last year and won the title, also won the championship this time around, scoring 183 points. Manhattan finished second with 138, just passing No.1 state ranked in Class 6A and defending state champion Garden City, who scored 137.5 points.

Fourth place went to Ark City with 127, followed by Mill Valley, 126; Newton, 119; Blue Valley Southwest, 111; Bishop Car-

roll, 101; Derby, 101; Holton, 101; Wichita Northwest, 97.5; Maize, 91; Colby, 88.5; Gardner Edgerton, 87; Norton, 80.5; Maize South, 68.5; Andover Central, 61; Hutchinson, 59; Emporia, 58.5; Leavenworth, 57.5; Wichita Heights, 53.5; Dodge City, 52.5; Lawrence, 52.5; Fredonia, 43; McPherson, 31.5; Wichita East, 18; Salina South, 16.

The Blue Jays won the team title in 2005 and 2006 and did not compete in 2007 due to inclement weather. In 2008 and 2009, Norton finished ninth as a team and in 2010 the Blue Jays placed fifth. In 2011, Norton had a stellar fourth place finish!

Five of the Norton wrestlers placed in the tournament. Junior Jared Tallent, 145, finished third; senior Alec Hager, 138, was sixth; freshman Jacob Green, 220, finished seventh; junior Caysean Campbell, 106, placed seventh and senior Cole Renner, 170, finished eighth.

Also wrestling for Norton were senior Ethan Ross, 120; sophomore Mike Kasson, 152; junior Kendall Miller, 160; senior Toby Nickell, 132; sophomore Jordan Dole, 195 and senior Branson Addington, 113.

"We enter the Newton Tournament of Champions to be tested and tested we were," said coach Johnson."We were in some real battles, some of which we came out on top and some we did not. But, the lesson we must take away from this is that each and everyone of our wrestlers learned that they have some weaknesses and we will work to improve on those weaknesses over the next few weeks.

"As a team, we placed five of the 11 athletes we took and scored about 20 points more than last year. We are not happy with the 15th place as a team. But, I remind our fans we also placed 15th last year. Several other wrestlers were just one match away from placing in the top eight. In a tournament of this quality, just being in the top eight is an accomplishment."

Since Jared Tallent placed highest for Norton, the Blue Jay coaching staff named him "Norton Wrestler of the Week". "He looked very good in all but one of his matches," said coach Johnson."For third place, he defeated last year's Class 6A state runner-up from Wichita Northwest." Tallent also finished eighth last year at Newton.

Norton had a 24-21 won-loss record and a 10-5 pin ratio.

Named "Outstanding Wrestler" of the tournament was the 138 pound champion Andrew Roias, Grand Island senior, who extended his perfect record so far this season to 30-0. He defeated No.1 seed Brogan Humphrey, Fredonia senior, 3-0 in the championship match.

Norton loses again to league tourney champion Plainville

The Norton Community High School boys basketball team met the top team in the Mid-Continent League for the second time in a week when they traveled to Plainville on Tuesday and lost again in a very similar game.

The first time it was the No.1 seed in the league tourney versus the No.8 Blue Jays and the result was a 60-43 loss. Plainville continued on to win the championship on Saturday in Hays.

This time, it was the regularly scheduled league game in Plainville and the Blue Jays battled hard as usual but still lost 61-45.

Tuesday, Plainville On jumped out to a 15-9 first quarter lead and was on top 32-19 at

the Cardinals added 16 to their total.

"Plainville is a very good basketball team," said Norton head coach Doug Reusink. "We have to stay disciplined and do things correctly to have a chance to win and we failed to do that in the second quarter. The Norton Community High School girls basketball team fell behind early and couldn't catchup in a Mid-Continent League 32-28 loss at Plainville on Tuesday evening.

The Lady Jays led the entire game when they defeated the Lady Cardinals last week in the MCL Tournament but it was a different story this time around.

Norton shooters were as cold as the outdoors as they failed to tally at all in the first quarter, which ended with Plainville on top 14-0.

Plainville had a cold second period when the Lady Cards hit just 5 points. Norton tallied 8 points but still trailed 19-8 at intermission. The Lady Cardinals added only 4 more points to their total in the third period while Norton scored 12 to cut the Plainville lead to 23-20.

The Norton girls continued to play hard in the final stanza and had several opportunities to win the game but they didn't materialize. The Lady Jays scored 8 points in the final period compared to 9 for the Lady Cards.

"We did not come out ready to play," said Norton head coach George Rossi.

"The bottom line is give the credit to Plainville for being aggressive and taking it to us. By the time we started to wake up, we were 14 or 15 points behind.

"I am very proud of how hard our girls played in the second half. We got back into the game but just couldn't get a lead or tie

"We need to do a better job of moving the ball and attacking the defense and scoring.
