# Area track teams compete at Norton invite

The Logan girls placed fourth with 74 points and the Northern Valley girls were fifth with 58 points.

In the boys division, Northern Valley finished third with 131 points and Logan was sixth with

# Blue Jays compete in Redmen Relays

Marysville won the girls championship with 113 points, followed by Beloit, 109; Norton, 88; Smith Center, 78; Phillipsburg, 77; Thayer Central, 65; Pike Valley, 56; Belleville, 28; Thunder Ridge, 11.

Beloit dominated the boys division by scoring 164 points, followed by Phillipsburg, 125; Thayer Central, 117; Smith Center, 105; Norton, 38; Belleville, 34; Pike Valley, 24; Marysville, 14; Thunder Ridge, 13.

"Overall, we had a good meet and, in some places, our performances were outstanding!", said Norton head coach Jason

The same foursome that won the 4 x 800 meter relay competed in the 4 x 400 meter relay and placed third in 4:31.45. Bailey Ambrosier also competed in the 400 meter dash where she finished third with a time of 1:05.04.
