The Norton Community High School Forensics Team won the state championship out of 43 schools at the 3A state championships on Saturday, May 3rd. Norton had one state champion at the tournament. Jared Shelton. Jared won the Serious Solo title. Bringing home 2nd place finishes were Neysa Carlson in both Poetry and Humorous Solo Acting, and Jared Shelton and Shelby Mulford in Serious Duet Acting. The team had four third place finishers

Morgan Farber took third in Informative, Steve Cummings took third in Poetry, Ashley Hildebrand and Skylar Davis took third in Serious Duet Acting, while Landon Slipke and Lauren Mordecai took third place in Humorous Duet Acting. Bringing home 4th place medals were Leif Carlson and Cody O'Hare in Humorous Duet Acting, Raenee Patterson in Informative, and Brionnah Fessler in Oration. Lauren Mordecai brought home a 5th place

The state tournament is broken into five rounds of performance. All participants perform in the first three preliminary rounds of the tournament. From there, the twelve

combined judges rankings break into the semifinals round. The top twelve entries/ students in each event perform again. The participants semifinals scores and preliminary rounds scores are then combined and the top Tyus Henson in Humorous Solo. six performers with the lowest score proceed

to the finals round. The top students perform

again in the final round and judges' rankings from the entire day are combined to determine the top six places. The maximum entries a team can bring to the state championship tournament are sixteen. Of Norton's sixteen entries, thirteen of them broke into semifinals and all thirteen of those entries broke into finals. "Winning a state championship was just icing on the cake of a great forensics season. I am extremely proud of my students. They are dedicated, hard workers who deserve the success they have achieved. I am lucky to get to coach such awesome, young people as well as have such a great assistant coach in Brandon Gay,' said Coach Steve Vance. Norton finished the tournament with 399 points, followed by St. George-Rock Creek with 348, and Minneapolis with 280. Also on May 3rd, the team's several students participated in the forensics state festival competition. State festival is run just like state music. The students perform once and receive either an I, II, III, or IV ranking. Impressively, all students taking part in State Festival received the highest ranking of a I.
