State welcomes Run for the Wall Riders

Hundreds of motorcyclists will be traveling through Kansas en route to Washington, D.C., to honor military veterans May 17-19. Many of them are expected to stop at the Kansas Turnpike Topeka service area Monday where they will be welcomed by the Kansas Turnpike Authority, the Kansas Department of Transportation and the Kansas American Bikers Aimed Towards Education chapter.

"The KTA and KDOT have partnered with the Kansas ABATE chapter to host this unique event and welcome riders' on their trip through Kan-

sas," said Secretary of Transportation and Director of the Turnpike Mike King. "On behalf of all Kansans, I thank the veterans for their service to our country."

Run for the Wall recognizes the sacrifices and contributions made by veterans who have served our nation. The ride is designed to promote healing among veterans, their families and friends; to call for an accounting of all prisoners of war and those missing in action; to honor the memory of those killed in all wars; and support military personnel all over the

world.

Employees of the Turnpike Authority and Department of Transportation, along with local and state dignitaries, will pump gas, hand out water and greet the more than 500 motorcyclists and veterans that are expected as they make their way through Kansas. The Turnpike Authority is donating \$500 worth of gasoline to the riders.

This year's Run for the Wall is the 26th annual event. The ride started in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., on May 14, traveling three different routes and will join back together on May 23.

HANSEN MUSEUM

The Dane G. Hansen Museum presents "Earth and Loom: A Century of Native American Art," scheduled to open May 16 and run through July 13. This exhibit will consist of 20 Navajo weavings dating from the late 19th century to contemporary. They represent different regions and weaving styles over the past century. Also in the exhibit, will be 26 pieces of pueblo pottery representing the work of many significant Native American potters from nine different pueblos. This pottery also dates from the late 19th century to contemporary.

This exhibition is the private collection of Dennis and Carola Deschner of Phillipsburg. They started collecting nearly 30 years ago by accident when they bought a Navajo weaving in Colorado. They continued to find pieces as they traveled and fell in love with Southwestern art, basketry, and Pueblo pottery.

Our May Artist of the month is Roy Jessup from Oakley. He has watercolor and pencil drawings on sale through the month of May. Come in and check out the work of this extremely talented artist.

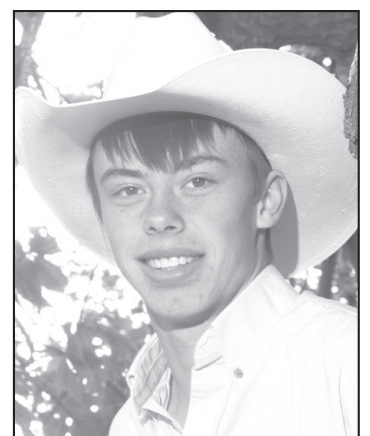

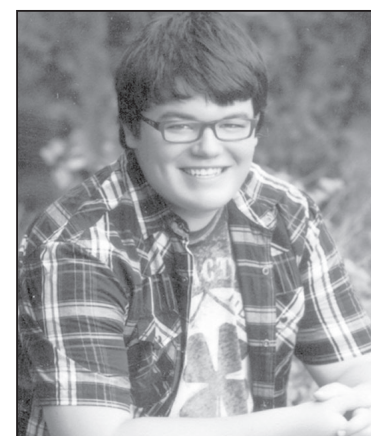

The Dane G. Hansen Foundation of Logan, Kansas has named 260 high school seniors from 59 Northwest Kansas schools as winners in its 39th annual scholarship competition. In addition, nine scholarships have been awarded to Kansas Community or Technical College Transfer students who are planning to continue their education at a Kansas four-year college or university.

In selecting award winners, the Scholarship Committee considered proficiency in verbal and writing skills. Other important factors are academic records, test scores, and community service in which the student may have participated.
