

Young Norton golfers continue to improve

The young, inexperienced Norton Community High School golf team continued to show improvement during the Mel Schremmer Invitational Golf Tournament held in cold and windy conditions in Phillipsburg on Monday. Despite the weather, most of the Blue Jays had better scores on the back nine, which had not always been the case earlier in the season. "We are continuing to see

improvements but in different ways," said Norton head golf coach David Stover. "One of our weaknesses all season has been that we would not see improvement from front nine to back nine but that was not the case today. Against very cold and windy conditions, we were able to have lower back nine scores from five of our six golfers and Quinton Porter had a very good front nine to carry us to our overall team score." The Norton four-man team placed fourth out of nine teams

and the two-man team finished tenth out of 11 squads. Plainville won the four-man competition with a 342, followed by Phillipsburg, 347; Osborne, 380; Norton, 388; Phillipsburg JV, 388; Thomas More Prep-Hays, 404; Oberlin, 410; Stockton, 411; Ellis, 424. In two-man play, Oberlin won the team championship with a 161, followed by Phillipsburg, 164; Ellis, 171; TMP, 171; Plainville, 178; Stockton, 180; Smith Center, 190; Northern Valley, 198; Phillipsburg JV,

214; Norton, 227; Phillipsburg C, 231. Results of Norton's two-man team were: freshman Landon Porter, 54/52-106 and sophomore Skylar Johnson, 61/60-121. In four-man play, sophomore Quinton Porter shot a 43/49-92, followed by junior Derek Rowh, 50/46-96; senior Garrett Otter, 50/48-98 and sophomore Nick Peterson, 55/47-102. Individual medalists were: Kelly Brown, Oberlin, 74; Skyler Tebo, Ellis, 76; Michael

Dusin, Phillipsburg, 77; Craig Garvert, Plainville, 80; Lucas Jacobs, Phillipsburg, 82; Keaton Orr, Phillipsburg, 83; Max Megaffin, TMP, 85; Lane Fisher, TMP, 85; Kaleb Conway, Osborne, 86; Hayden Rohr, TMP, 86. "Our next step of improvement will come from the consistency necessary to go out and shoot low early and continue that pace throughout the entire round," said coach Stover. "This improvement will be necessary in the very near future as we head toward the post season with the league tournament at Smith Center on Thursday and the Class 3A Regional Golf Tournament on Monday at Norton."

Competing, in addition to Norton and Smith Center, were teams from Phillipsburg, Ellis, Hill City, Oakley, Plainville, Stockton and Thomas More Prep of Hays. Results were not available at the Norton Telegram's press time. **Regional Tournament** Norton will host the Class 3A Regional Golf Tournament this Monday, May 19 at the Prairie Dog Recreation Association Golf Course south of Norton. In addition to Norton, teams will be competing from Beloit, Ellsworth, Thomas More Prep-Hays, Hoisington, Minneapolis, Phillipsburg and Sacred Heart of Salina. Play will begin at 9 a.m.

Resolution to Levy Tax for Capital Outlay Fund

RESOLUTION TO LEVY TAX FOR CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND
WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 212, Norton County, State of Kansas, is authorized by K.S.A. 72-8801, to make an annual tax levy at a mill rate not exceeding the statutorily-prescribed mill rate for a period of time as determined by the Board of Education upon the taxable tangible property in the district for the purpose specified in said law; and
WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined to exercise the authority vested in it by said law;
NOW, THEREFORE,
RESOLUTION
Be It Resolved that:
The above-named school board shall be authorized to make a continuous and permanent annual tax levy not to exceed 8 mills upon the taxable tangible property in the school district for the purpose of acquisition, construction, reconstruction, repair, remodeling, additions to, furnishing, maintaining and equipping of school district property and equipment necessary for school district purposes, including (1) Acquisition of computer software; (2) acquisition of performance uniforms; (3) housing and boarding pupils enrolled in an area vocational school operated under the board; (4) architectural expenses; (5) acquisition of building sites; (6) undertaking and maintenance of asbestos control projects; (7) acquisition of school buses; and (8) acquisition of other fixed assets, and for the purpose of paying a portion of the principal and interest on bonds issued by cities under the authority of K.S.A. 12-1774, and amendments thereto, for the financing of redevelopment projects upon property located within the school district. The tax levy authorized by this resolution may be made, unless a petition in opposition to the same, signed by not less than 10% of the qualified electors of the school district, is filed with the county election officer of the home county of the school district within 40 calendar days after the last publication of this resolution. In the event a petition is filed, the county election officer shall submit the question of whether the tax levy shall be authorized to the electors in the school district at an election called for that purpose or at the next general election, as is specified by the Board of Education of the above school district.
