Only two players graduated from last season's strong team. "This year's team features an

experienced group of returning players, so my expectations are pretty high," said coach Green. "Add to the fact that Josh Van-Laeys will return after missing last season with an injury.

"I really don't think we have any major weaknesses and I think our pitching will be a strong point of this team. We return our top three pitchers in Jacob, Jace and Trenton with them having a lot of innings pitched. Eight of our 14 players have pitched at this level last season and I feel comfortable having any of them on the mound.

"Jacob, Jace and Collyn were our top hitters last season and Josh will only make those areas even stronger.

"We should also be solid defensively. My top ten players are pretty interchangeable, meaning they can play several different positions, both infield

and outfield.

"Hayden, Riley and Ross all got some valuable playing time last year as first year players and Wilson and Ryan show signs of major improvement as they have gotten faster and stronger.

"This year's newcomers, Braden, Dallas, Tucker and Miles, have a lot of learning to do but have made strides since the first practice. To help them along, I hope to add some extra practice games for them. These games will be in addition to our full schedule."
