Blue Jays perform well in Regional Track

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School girls and boys track and field teams had an outstanding day in what was considered to be the toughest Class 3A Regional Track and Field Meet in the state on Friday in Phillipsburg.

The Norton girls qualified eight and two Blue Jay boys qualified to compete in the State Meet this Friday and Saturday in Cessna Stadium in Wichita.

Hesston won the girls championship with 69 points, followed by Hutch-Trinity, 66; Marion, 63; Marysville, 60; Beloit, 60; Southeast of Saline, 58; Norton, 39; Minneapolis, 28; Phillipsburg, 26; Halstead, 20; Sacred Heart of Salina, 18; Lyons, 17; Ellsworth, 15; Hays-Thomas More Prep Marian, 10; Riley County, 8; Hoisington, 1.

The boys champion was Beloit with 108 points, followed by Phillipsburg, 94; Hesston, 65: Salina Sacred Heart, 57; Marion, 46; Hays Thomas More Prep, 37; Southeast of Saline, 30; Minneapolis, 27; Norton, 24; Halstead, 24; Riley County, 14; Hoisington, 14; Hutch-Trinity 9; Marysville, 6; Lyons, 2; Ellsworth, 1.

"We had an awesome day of competition," said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "It was cooler and cloudy but our athletes competed well.

"We will take eight girls to state and two boys.

"We suffered some tough losses, which can happen in the regional meet but we also put up some performances that led to multiple individual personal records and two individual regional championships. Austin Hager vaulted 14' to win and defend his regional championship from last year and our girls 4 x 800 meter relay team of Sierra Griffith, Katelyn Engelbert, Casey Ambrosier and Bailey Ambrosier bettered their previous personal best by over 22 seconds to win that event.

"Our athletes did exactly what

we had asked them to do. This track meet was about being tough, competing tough, putting the weather conditions aside and leaving it all on the competition venue. Our athletes did just those things.

"Our young athletes learned a lot about competing at a championship level and our athletes displayed sportsmanship and class.

"We are proud of the effort with which our athletes competed, we are happy about the personal records that came our way, we are very excited about our athletes who qualified and earned opportunities to compete at the state meet and look forward to all that the coming week will bring!"

The Norton boys who qualified are Austin Hager in the pole vault and Deon Lyle in the high jump.

The top four finishers in each event qualified for the Kansas State High School Track and Field Meet in Wichita this weekend.

The Lady Jays' 4 x 800 meter relay team of junior Sierra Griffith, senior Katelyn Engelbert, sophomore Casey Ambrosier and senior Bailey Ambrosier was timed in a personal record time of 10:09.55 in winning that event.

The same foursome just missed qualifying in the 4 x 400 meter relay where they were timed in 4:19.37 to place fifth.

Bailey Ambrosier and junior Kenzie Esslinger tied for third in the pole vault with a clearance of 9'6". Alicia Maloney of Marion was the champion with a 10'6" vault and Madison Hewitt, Beloit, placed second with a clearance of 10'.

Lady Jay senior Darcy Bainter, who has been a steady distance race performer for four years, missed the state meet with a sixth place finish in the 3200 meter run with a time of 12:43.90.

Freshman Baylee Miller will have future chances to qualify for the state meet in the high jump. Her clearance of 4'10" placed fifth, just missing a trip to Wichita. She would have qualified with a 5' jump.

Senior Austin Hager was Norton's only boys gold medal winner when he cleared 14' to win the pole vault and successfully defend his regional title from last season.

Junior Deon Lyle won a silver medal with a second place finish in the high jump with a personal best height of 6'4".

Lyle cleared the same height as Ryan Mayorga of Thomas More Prep but had more misses at that height.

Norton had some fifth places that just fell short of qualifying for the big show.

Senior Marc Miller finished ond event with a second place in fifth in the 800 meter run with a the 800 meter run with a person- near personal record of 2:03.80. He missed qualifying by less than two seconds!

Two Norton relays also placed fifth.

Norton's 4 x 100 meter relay team of Hager, sophomore Jordan Dole, senior Tanner Furbush and sophomore Gavin Lively was timed in 45.34. They were edged for fourth place and a spot in the state meet by a team from Beloit that was timed in 45.32!

Norton's other fifth place relay team consisted of Marc Miller, senior Trever Lewis, freshman Cruz Leon and freshman Tyus Henson who ran the 4 x 800 meter relay. They were timed in 8:54.22.

Brooke did just miss qualifying in two other events, however. She was fifth in the 300 meter hurdles with a time of 50.82 and sixth in the 100 meter hurdles in 17.29.

Junior Kortney Cunningham missed returning to the state meet with a fifth and two sixth places. She finished fifth in the javelin with a throw of 111'6", sixth in the triple jump with a distance of 32'6.25" and sixth in the high jump with a clearance of 5'.

Senior sprinter Michaela Girard had a great day in the regional tournament, winning two gold medals and running on a third place relay team.

She was timed in 13.29 to win the 100 meter dash and in 27.22 to hit the finish line first in the 200 meter dash.

Sophomore Christen Greving placed third in the shot put with a heave of 36'5.5". She was also a member of the 4 x 100 meter relay team along with Girard, freshman Karlee Braun and freshman Kayla Hofaker which finished third in a time of 52.80.

Hofaker also qualified for the big show with a third place finish in the long jump with a leap of 16'2.75". She also qualified for state with a fourth place in the 400 meter dash with a clocking of 1:04.09.
