Norton Blue Jays compete at State track meet

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Eight Norton Community High School girls and boys competed in the 104th Kansas State Track & Field Championships on Friday and Saturday in Cessna Stadium in Wichita.

The six Lady Jays who competed placed 20th out of 41 teams and the two Norton boys competing finished 15th out of 46 teams.

The top four finishers in all events in the four regional meets the week before qualified to compete in the Kansas State Meet, the largest high school track and field meet in the United States! Around 3,500 athletes competed in the meet.

Cheney and Garden Plain switched places from last year's Class 3A girls championship race. Cheney won it this year with 69 points and last year's champion Garden Plain scored 54 to place second this year. The Hiawatha girls placed third with 43 points, followed by Hesston, 41; Marion, 39; Silver Lake, 29.33; Beloit, 28.33; Kingman, 27; Wichita Collegiate, 26; Hutchinson Trinity, 26 in the top ten.

The Norton girls scored 13.5 points. Phillipsburg and Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays tied for 35th with 3 points each.

The Phillipsburg boys placed second last year but earned the title this season with 69 points. Beloit was second with 64 points, followed by Hesston, 55; Caney Valley, 49; Sacred Heart, 43; Wichita Collegiate, 39; Haven, 31, Holcomb, 29; Chaparral, 27.5; Thomas More Prep of Hays, 24 for the top ten teams.

In Class 1A, the Northern Valley girls scored 6 points and the Logan girls tallied 5 points.

Valley Heights was the girls 1A champion with 62 points, followed by Pike Valley, 54; Marais des Cygne, 51; Linn, 37; Wheatland, 31; Minneola, 27.5; Beloit St. John's 24; Triplains, 24; Hoxie, 23, Cunningham, 22 in the top ten. Quinter placed 11th with 19 points, Weskan tied for 18th with 15, Osborne tied for 21st with 12, St. Francis tied for 25th with 10, Cheylin tied for 27th with 9, Golden Plains was 30th with 8.25. Thunder Ridge scored 3 points and Sharon Springs tallied 1 point.

In 1A boys competition, Centralia won the championship with 51 points, followed by Macksville, 48.5; Hanover, 41; Osborne, 37; Valley Heights, 36.5; La Crosse, 35; Linn, 31; Sharon Springs, 30; Otis-Bison, 30 and Stockton 29 to round out the top ten. Hoxie tied for 15th with 17, St. Francis was 20th with 12, Wheatland tied for 23rd with 10, Victoria tied for 28th with 10, Thunder Ridge tied for 37th with 5 and Weskan was 52nd with 1.5.

"We had a very good weekend!" said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "We are proud of our athletes who represented Norton at the state track meet. As always, they deserve what they earned and their efforts and performances command respect. They did a nice job and this trip was a great conclusion to a great season.

"All of our athletes competed hard and well and their performances reflected that. Earning the right to compete in this meet is a testament to their track and field success and, for earning that chance, they each deserve recognition. It is an honor for them to earn this competitive opportunity.

"Not everything went exactly how we would have scripted it. Cristine Nelson, who made her first appearance at the state meet, finished in 15th overall in the shot put and Bailey Ambrosier medaled in the pole vault with her sixth place finish but she would have loved to finish much higher. Both young ladies handled themselves and their disappointment very well and with class. The chips of competition don't always fall how we would like them to but these two young ladies competed and handled themselves like champions. We are proud of them for that.


Chuck is currently the head boys basketball coach. His team qualified for the state tournament this past season. He also serves as the head boys and girls track coach.
