K-18 wins double header on home field

After losing a doubleheader at Colby on Thursday, June 19, the Norton K-18 baseball team returned to the friendly diamond at John Ryan Field in Norton on Monday, June 23 and won a doubleheader from Oakley.

Colby

The opener with Colby was a close one that could have gone either way and ended with Norton losing 5-4.

Colby took an early 3-0 lead in the bottom of the first. Norton narrowed the lead to 3-1 in the top of the third when Josh VanLaeys singled for the second time in the game, Jacob Green and Collyn Auker both walked, Trenton Wright singled and VanLaeys scored.

Colby scored one more run in the bottom of the third to extend their lead to 4-1. The top of the fifth was a big inning for the Blue Jays, who scored three runs to tie the score at 4-all. Riley Sides walked, VanLaeys smashed a double for his third hit, Auker, Will Ellis and Ross Cole all singled. Sides, VanLaeys and Auker all scored.

Colby broke the tie with one run in the top of the eighth inning and Norton was unable to score in the bottom of the eighth.

Norton had 9 hits, 5 walks and 5 strike outs. VanLaeys had a perfect night at the plate, going 4 for 4 with the bat. Cole was 2 for 3 batting. VanLaeys was also the Norton pitcher. In seven innings, he gave up 11 hits, walked 4 and struck out 5 batters. He was relieved by Hayden Wiltfong, who pitched one-third inning, allowing 2 hits, no walks and striking out none.

The score was tied 2-all early in the nightcap before Colby took charge in the third and fourth innings, scoring three runs in the third and six in the fourth. Norton tallied one run in the top of the first inning when VanLaeys walked, Green was hit by a pitch and walked, Auker singled

and Wright walked and Green scored.

Norton added another run in the top of the third when Green and Wright both singled and Green scored. Norton scored two more runs in the top of the fourth when Ryan Lively, Van-Laeys and Green all singled and Lively and VanLaeys both scored.

Colby added one more run in the bottom of the fifth inning.

Norton had nine hits, four walks and five strike outs. Green was 2 for 3 with the bat and VanLaeys was 2 for 4.

Jacob Green pitched three innings for Norton, giving up 6 hits, walking 3 and striking out 7. Riley Sides relieved him for three innings, giving up just 1 hit, walking 6 and striking out none.

"After having almost two weeks off because of postponed games, I figured we would come out a little flat and I was right," said Norton head coach Rick Green. "We actually hit the ball better than I expected and had some hard luck hitting. We hit a lot of hard balls right at defenders and they made the plays.
