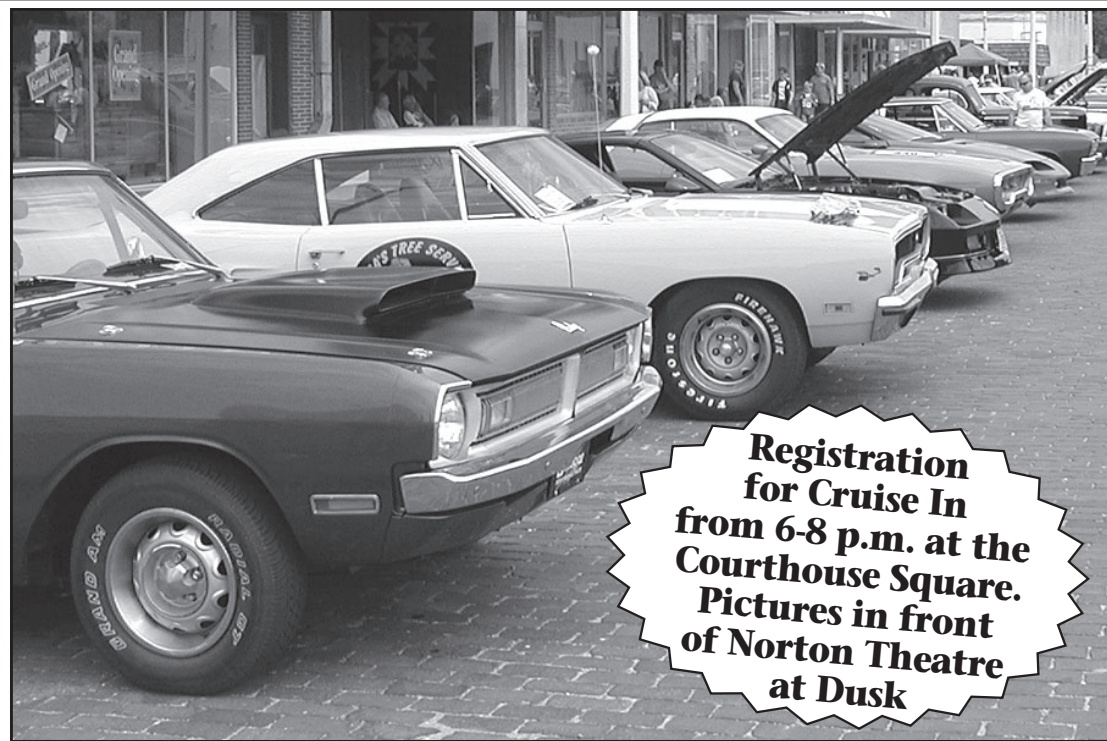
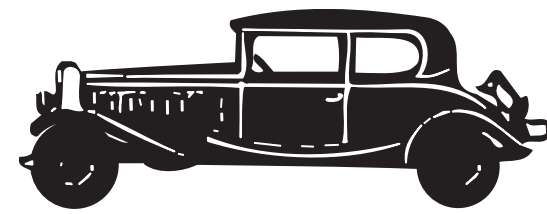
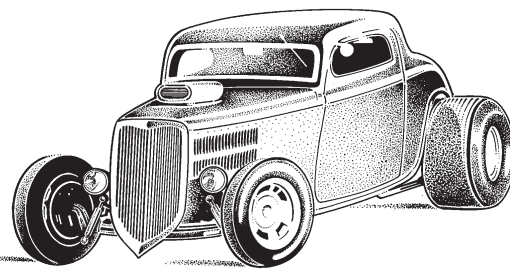
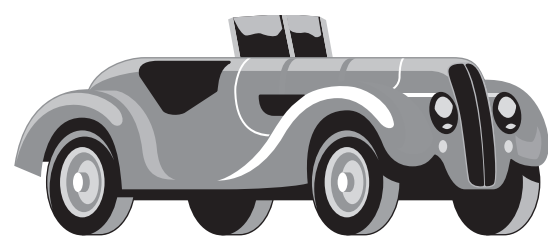
Visiting Alfred and Betty Cressler Sunday were their son Don and Tricia Cressler and family from Norton.
