# Brewster Bulldogs down Northern Valley Huskies

Try as they might, Northern Valley couldn't shut down Brewster in last night's Bi-District football game, losing 86-66.

Brewster was first on the board in the first quarter when Sean Swanson dashed 1 yard for six points, and then added two more when Branson Gilley passed to Heath Baird for the extra points.

The ball was in constant motion and the lead was in a state of flux throughout the second quarter with the Huskies scoring four times and Brewster scoring three.

Jesse Hilburn evened the score for Northern Valley on an 8 yard run at 9:09 with a pass from Joey Copper to Thomas Ostmeyer for the conversion.

Three minutes later, Swanson made another 1 yard run, scoring for the Bulldogs. Ostmeyer was next in line for a touchdown on a 15 yard scramble at 5:06 and then ran in the extra two.

The pigskin made it to the Brewster end zone a minute later on another 1 yard run, this one made by Joel Selby. At 1:13, Copper's 10 yard completed pass to Garth Gebhard made the next green touchdown with Ostmeyer making a fumble recovery for the points after.

The Bulldogs took back the lead with :39 showing on a 25 yard pass from Gilley to Swanson. But it wasn't for long as the Huskies made the final play of the first half with Copper throwing 36 yards to Ostmeyer for a touchdown as the buzzer sounded, making the tally 32-26.

With 9:20 showing, Brewster was back in the end zone in the third quarter on an 11 yard run by Swanson.

The Bulldogs widened the gap just a tad more nearly two minutes later as Paul Flanders intercepted the ball, then returned it 26 yards. Swanson ran in the Bulldogs' first points after since the beginning of the game.

Copper evened the score with 2:29 left in the quarter on a 1 yard dash across the line and a completed conversion.

Then at :13, Brewster gained 8 more points on a 22 yard run from Jake Long with Swanson bringing in the extra points, for a score of 48-40.

The fourth quarter was another one filled with touchdowns. The Huskies began it when Clarke Nelson completed his 14 yard run and then ran in the points after.

Next it was Swanson, with 9:11 showing, on a 15 yard run with Gilley making the conversion.

A couple of minutes later, Nelson found himself back in the end zone on a 30 yard scramble. Then it was Swanson again, this time on a 23 yard run. He also made the points after.

Nelson wasn't finished yet as he proved 28 seconds later when he dashed 61 yards for a touchdown.

With 3:22 on the clock, Swanson scrambled 35 yards for six points and then made the conversion. Copper made Northern Valley's last touchdown with 1:46 left in the game on a 1 yard run.

Ten seconds later, Swanson made his last touchdown on a 40 yard run.

The final score of the game was made with :42 showing by Long

on a 35 yard run. Gilley passed to Swanson for the extra points, making the final tally 86-66 in Brewster's favor.

"This was a wild one!" said Coach Chuck Fessenden. "There was a lot of offense and not much defense.

"Brewster was able to throw on us in the first half. In the second half we could not shut down their big tailback.

"I am proud of the way our kids kept answering every score with a score of our own.

"We appreciate our seniors' efforts and will miss Garth, Ryan, Steve and Zack."

Copper led rushing for the Huskies with 188 yards on 28 carries. He was followed by Nelson, 110 yards on 6 carries; Hilburn, 92 yards on 19 carries; and Ostmeyer, 50 yards on 12 carries.

Copper completed 6 of 14 passes for 98 yards. Receiving were Ostmeyer, 4 for 76 yards; and Gebhard, 2 for 22 yards.

Punting were Copper, 3 for 97 yards; and Ostmeyer, 1 for 13 yards. Avery Thalheim made 4 kick-offs for 130 yards and Copper made 5 kick-offs for 134 yards. Hilburn made 8 kick-off returns for 138 yards.

Leading tacklers were Ostmeyer, 13 solos, 2 assists; Copper, 12 solos, 4 assists; Zack King, 10 solos, 3 assists; Thalheim, 6 solos, 4 assists; Nelson, 5 solos, 4 assists; Hilburn 5 solos, 2 assists; Gebhard, 4 solos, 4 assists; Ryan Shearer, 2 solos, 1 assist; Cole Kinderknecht, 2 assists; and Scott Shearer, 1 assist.
