Neil W. Reeves

Jan. 13, 1916 - Nov. 2, 2003

Neil Walter Reeves, 87, died Nov. 2, 2003, at the Norton County Hospital.

Mr. Reeves was born Jan. 13, 1916, in Alma to Dr. Arthur G. and Flora (Wildeman) Reeves.

The family moved to Oberlin when he was young so his father could assist his brother, Dr. Eber Reeves, in his medical practice. Mr. Reeves became head of the household when his father died.

He graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1934, and attended Pittsburg State College for two years. The family returned to Alma where he was a farmer and worked in a livestock operation northwest of Alma.

He married Naomi G. Thomas and they had one daughter, Janeil Lynn. Both preceded him in death.

On March 15, 1970, Mr. Reeves and Grace (Bell) Eckhart of Norcat were married. They continued to make their home on the farm northwest of Alma until moving into Alma in 1995.

He was an active member of the Alma United Methodist Church and had served on the first Soil Conservation Board in Norton County. He also served on the Norton County Senior Citizens Board.

He was instrumental in getting the Alma Senior Center started and served on the board organiz-

ing the Wheatridge Apartments in Alma.

He served on the Mt. Hope Cemetery Board for many years. He was an active member of the Masonic lodge, earning his life membership in five different orders — Eastern Star, Blue Lodge, Chapter, Commandry and Shrine, — and had served in several offices.

Survivors include: his wife, Grace, of the home in Alma; a step-son, Bill Eckhart, Sharon Springs; a daughter-in-law, Rose Eckhart, Hill City; six grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; a brother, Ross and Margaret Reeves, Phillipsburg; two sisters, Lois and Clarence Schamber, Phillipsburg; and Alice Kuiper, Alma.

A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m., Saturday, Nov. 15, 2003, at the United Methodist Church, Alma with Kathy Aeillo officiating.
