Jays win **Bi-district** crown

The Norton Community High School football team extended its unbeaten record to 10-0 with a 42-7 victory over the visiting Ellinwood Eagles Tuesday.

First quarter

Norton came out fired up. Running back Aaron Overlease returned the opening kickoff to the 35. Quarterback Dan Roeder, who shredded the Eagle defense, ran the keeper for a first down on the 43.

Tailback Charlie Kohfeld ran through a hole in the Ellinwood line for a first down on the Ellinwood 41. Fullback Jordon Haussermann bulled to the 34. Kohfeld fumbled when hit but recovered on the 33. Haussermann ran to the 30 for a first down. Kohfeld found no room but Roeder completed a flat pass to senior wide receiver Jered Sloan on the 24. Overlease ran to the 19 for a first down.

On the next play, Haussermann ran through a hole, broke a tackle and sprinted into the end zone for Norton's first touchdown. Kicker Charlie Foley got the extra point and Norton led 7-0.

Foley boomed the kickoff into the end zone. Ellinwood's quarterback Cody Engle fumbled but recovered for no gain. On second down, defensive end C.J. Thiele sacked Engle back on the 12. Running back Josh Williams gained three and Ellinwood punted. Running back Kyle Kats caught the ball, got a block from Overlease and was off for a 50-yard touchdown. Foley kicked the extra point and Norton suddenly led 14-0.

Foley kicked into the end zone again. Engle completed a pass to running back Jeff Steinert for three. Williams picked up six before Bo Pfannenstiel tackled him. The Norton defense stopped Ellinwood short of a first down but a personal foul penalty against the Jays moved the ball to the 45 and gave the Eagles a first down. Brian Luft sacked Engle back on the 37. Williams tried the Norton line again and lost three. A pass fell incomplete and Ellinwood punted.

Kats got a good return across midfield but the Blue Jays were penalized for blocking in the back. Haussermann found a hole and ran for a first down on the 44. Haussermann plunged for two yards, then Roeder ran a keeper to the Ellinwood 44 for an apparent first down but, as he tried for extra yardage, the ball was knocked out of his arms and Ellinwood recovered Linebacker Ryan Maddy batted down an Engle pass. A second pass was incomplete and the Eagles were penalized five for illegal motion. On third down, running back Tyler Wirtz caught an Engle pass that had been deflected by the Blue Jay secondary and the Eagles had a first down. Maddy and tackle Joel Griffiths stopped Williams for no gain but Engle passed to Steinert and he was tackled by Maddy on the 28 for the first down.



Kohfeld gained three, then Overlease ran for five yards and plowed ahead for three but Norton

Coach Bruce Graber's Norton Community High School football team will take their unbeaten 10-0 record to Holcomb on Saturday to play for the Regional Championship.

Kickoff against the 6-4 Holcomb team will be at 2 p.m.

On Tuesday evening, Norton won their Bi-District with a 42-7 victory over Ellinwood. Holcomb won their Bi-District with a 21-14 victory over Elkhart. Ellinwood brought a 7-2 record into the game with Norton and Elkhart was also 7-2 when Holcomb defeated them.

Although Holcomb has lost four games, Coach Graber stated during Wednesday's Blue Jay Booster Club meeting that they have played some tough teams. Two of their losses were to Oakley, who is still in the playoffs and will play Smith Center on Saturday, and Goodland, who is in the Class 4A playoffs.

'They are very large up front," saidCoachGraber. "Their tailback is quick and makes a lot of people miss.

"They give you lots of different looks offensively. They'll run the I, some option and lots of sweeps. They have several deceptive plays where they run back to the weak side. They throw the ball deep a lot."

During the victory over Elkhart, Holcomb showed a balanced offense. Back Colter Brau a 5'8", 150 pound senior, carried the ball 13 times for 86 yards for a 6.6 yards per carry average. Senior Kirk Kaps, who is a 5'8", 145 pound wide receiver and back, carried the ball only 10 times but for 84 yards and an 8.4 yards per carry average. Quarterback Luke Joel Griffiths, three assists; Heath Staab, a 6', 190 pound senior, carried the ball 11 times for 60 yards Luke Pfannenstiel, one solo, one for 5.5 yards per carry and com- assist each; Lucas Wiseman, two pleted 4 of 7 passes for 37 yards assists; Austin Brooks, Jordon and one interception. Kaps is his leading receiver.

He is also a punt returner and kickoff returner and punts for the Blue Jays. He has run for 13 touchdowns and passed for 14 touchdowns.

Senior tailback Charlie Kohfeld has carried the ball 139 times for 786 yards and a 5.7 yards per carry average. He has scored eight touchdowns.

Leading pass receiver is senior Jered Sloan with 24 receptions for 447 yards and an 18.6 yards per catch average.

Senior receiver Bruce Rushton also has 19 catches for 284 yards and a 14.9 yards per reception average.

Leading tackler for Norton is senior linebacker Bo Pfannenstiel with 44 solos and 38 assists for 82 total tackles.

Leading tacklers in Norton's 42-14 win over Beloit for the District championship were not available when the game story was written.

Pfannenstiel was the tackling leader against Beloit with seven solo tackles, five assists for 12 total tackles.
