Blue Jays fall to Cardinals in final game

The Norton Community High School football team fell 20-13 to the two-time defending champion Conway Springs Cardinals in Conway Springs.

Conway Springs, who is ranked No. 1 in the state, has now won 39 straight football games. A year ago, the Cardinals came to Norton and left with a 34-27 victory.

Both teams played well but, in the end, Conway Springs was able to come out on top

First quarter

Norton senior kicker Charlie Foley kicked off to Conway Springs to start the game. The Blue Jays came charging downfield and senior end C.J. Thiele tackled junior Eric Matthews on the 15. Senior back Darrin Seiwert gained only one yard as senior defensive end Joel Griffiths tackled him. Senior back Brent Linn tried the Norton line and Thiele tackled him after a four yard gain; however, on third down Seiwert ran into the Norton secondary and senior defensive back Bruce Rushton tackled him on the 30 after he'd earned a first down. Junior quarterback Matt Wykes tried a keeper but senior defensive back Jered Sloan and senior linebacker Tom Graham stopped him for no gain. The Cardinals went to the air and Wykes completed a pass to senior end Rodney Chitwood on the Norton 32 for another first down. Seiwert ran to the 24 on first down, then broke several tackles as he powered into the end zone. Senior Jason Benge kicked the extra point and Conway led 7-0 with 8:44 left in the first quarter.

The kickoff was short and senior Josh Green returned the ball to the 40. Senior quarterback Dan Roeder ran for six, then senior tailback Charlie Kohfeld bulled ahead for two. On third and two, a pass fell incomplete and Roeder went back in punt formation. A low snap from the center caused him to run the ball but he was downed short of the first down and Conway took over.

Illegal procedure cost the Cards five yards. Chitwood appeared to have another pass reception but Sloan jarred the ball out of his hands. Linn gained just two yards before Thiele tackled him. Norton put on a good pass rush on third down and a Wykes pass fell inpenalty against Conway. Kohfeld drove for three yards, then senior fullback Jordon Haussermann ran up the middle for a first down on the 24. Roeder passed to Sloan for a first down on the 36. Roeder went back to pass again but was sacked on the 30. Junior running back Aaron Overlease made just two yards, another pass was incomplete and Roeder punted to the Conway Springs 13.

Matthews gained a yard before Roeder came up from his linebacker spot to get him. Wykes gained another yard before Thiele tackled him. A pass was incomplete and Conway punted. The ball rolled dead on the Norton 43. Overlease ran for five but gained nothing on second down. Roeder passed to Sloan for a first down on the Conway 47. Overlease gained one yard and the quarter was over with Conway leading 7-0.

Second quarter Haussermann gained three yards, a pass was incomplete and Roeder punted. The ball rolled dead on the 3 yard line. Matthews was tackled by senior linebacker Bo Pfannenstiel and Griffiths for no gain. Seiwert gained seven yards, then got loose to the 37 for a first down before Graham and Pfannenstiel tackled him. Conway fumbled in the backfield but fell on the ball for a loss back to the 31. Wykes completed a pass to senior back Travis Cook on the Norton 35 for another first down. Junior back Stewart Hoover gained seven yards to the 29, then Seiwert plowed to the 15 before Sloan tackled him. Benge got a carry and gained nothing. Someone will have to play awfully well to beat them. They can hurt you in so many ways. It's hard to get to the top and harder to stay there.


