'The Extra' to debut next week

Next Monday, Norton County residents will receive a new publication — the *Telegram Extra* — in place of *The Norton County Telegram*.

The *Telegram Extra* will be in a new, easier-to-handle tabloid format and will have classified ads from across northwest Kansas, eastern Colorado and southwest Nebraska, from Burlington to Phillipsburg and from the Nebraska border to Oakley.

Each classified in *The Extra* will also go into the *Country Advocate*, a shopper which is delivered to households in St. Francis; Bird City; Atwood; Oberlin; Goodland; Colby; Oakley; Burlington, Colo.; and everywhere in between including some communities in Nebraska.

If you have a car to sell, now you can have an audience of almost 42,000 prospective buyers both in the Norton area and outside.

"I sold my mother's car to a woman, who lives near Gove," *Telegram* Publisher Cynthia Haynes said. "I put the ad in the *Country Advocate* and I had calls from people in Herndon, St. Francis and Oakley interested in the vehicle.

"The *Telegram Extra* will provide Norton residents with this huge market for their unneeded items or the services they offer. It's a great way to get the information out."

Each issue of the *Extra* will also have a schedule of events for the area and all the advertising normally found in the Monday paper.

The *Telegram Extra* will be delivered by carrier and mail on the same time schedule as the present *Norton County Telegram*.

Meanwhile, *The Norton Telegram* will be delivered on Tuesdays and Fridays starting Dec. 2.

The Telegram will be expanded to include an editorial page on Friday and the Wednesday edition will include the *Country Advocate*, a popular ads-only paper which is circulated throughout the northwest Kansas and into eastern Colorado and southern Nebraska.
