# Voters can pick committee

Norton County ag producers have until Monday to return their ballots for the election to fill vacant seats on the U.S. Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency county committee.

Up for election are Marion Oter, New Almelo (seeking a second term); Ray Mizell, Norton; Beverly Miller, Norton County.

Farmers and ranchers, who are eligible to participate in federal farm programs, elect a three-person county committee, which reviews county office operations and makes some of the decisions

on how to apply the programs. Those elected serve a three year term. They can run for a maximum of three terms.

"This is an important position that gives farmers and ranchers a real voice on how the federal programs affect their communities and their individual operations," said Vesta Hobbs, Norton County agency Executive Director.

Ballots listing the candidates were sent this week to all eligible voters listed in the agency's records for Norton County. Those who have not received a ballot, may pick one up at the

Norton office. Ballots must be filled out, signed, and returned to the Farm Service Agency office. Write-in candidates are accepted. Unsigned ballots and those not filled out correctly will be discarded, as will those received or post-marked after Dec. 1.

Ms. Hobbs reported that people can mail their ballots or deliver them to the office. For more information, about the county committee and the election process, contact the agency's office at 877-5156. (See briefly on Page 1)

The town's grocery stores will be closed on Thursday. Both Jamboree and Shop and Save will open for regular business hours on Friday.

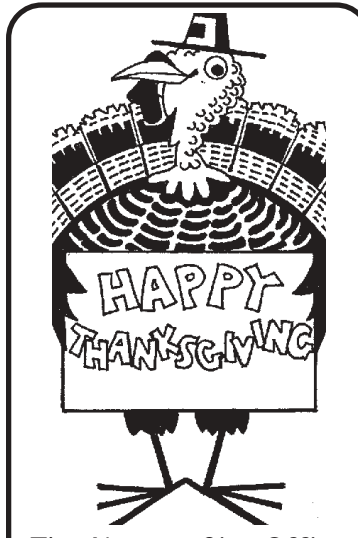
Pamida will be open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Thanksgiving day.
