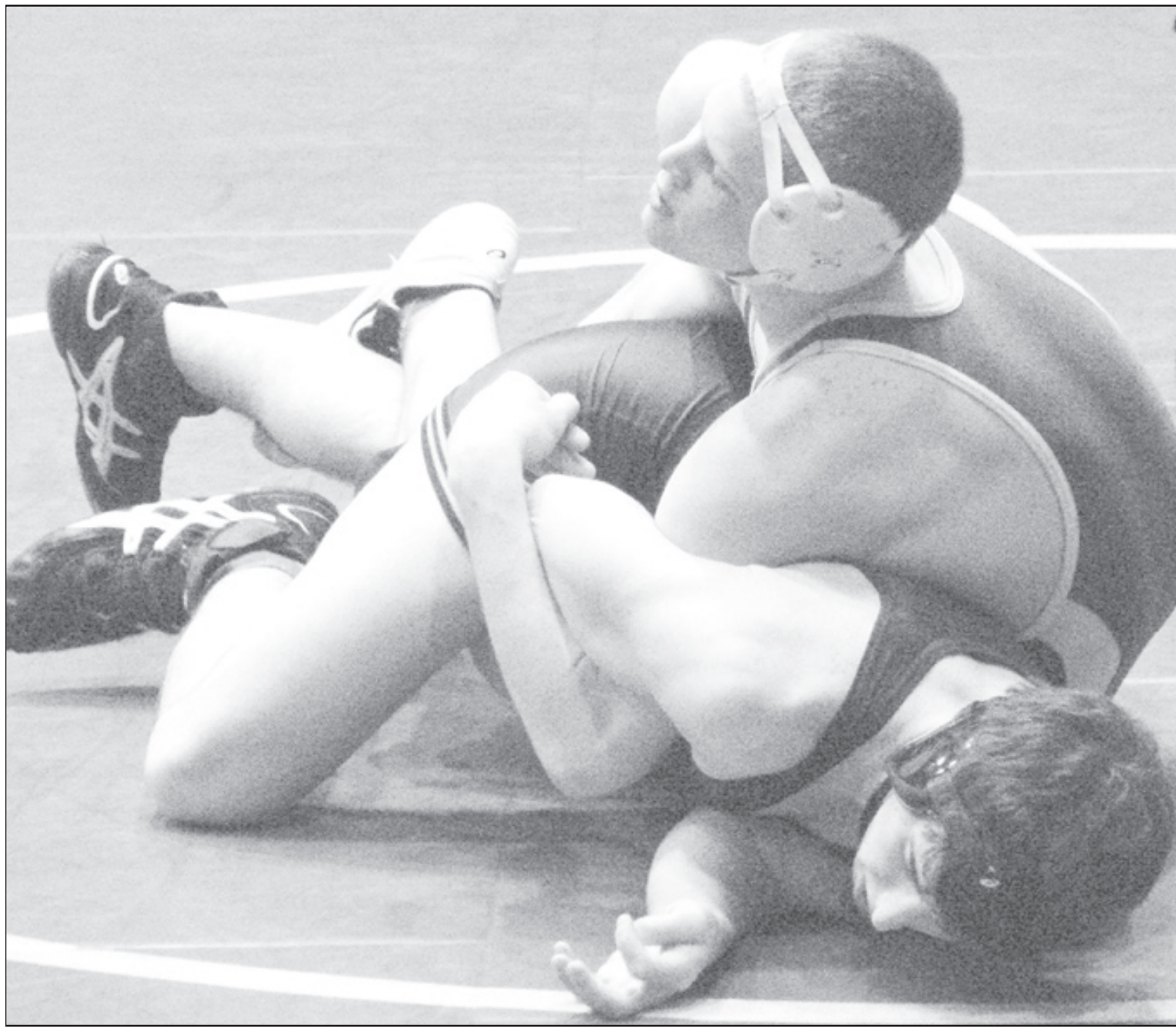


At the Game

Three place at Hays tournament

Even though St. Francis had the second smallest wrestling team at the Bob Kuhn Prairie Classic in Hays over the weekend, they earned 69 points.

The Indians were represented by eight wrestlers, Freddy Pacheco, Cody Sherlock, Darris Keller, Jesse Pacheco, Grady Brunk, Scott Ford, Adam Guthmiller and Nathan Lamb.

"We had six open weights," Coach Mike Frewen said. "Only one team had less wrestlers. It is tough to place at the top with fewer kids."

Three of the Saintry wrestlers placed: Keller was third at 135 pounds, Sherlock was fourth at 125 pounds and Brunk was fourth at 160 pounds.

We were wrestling without Terrence Lamb (injury) who would have earned 15-20 points for us said the coach.

The team wrestled at 50 percent with 15 wins and 15 losses.

The Indians had 22 takedowns; 13 three-point near falls; 4 two-point near falls; 9 reversals and 13 escapes. Wins included five by decision, nine by falls and one by

a tech fall.

"The tournament was even tougher than last year," Coach Frewen said. "There were more quality kids in the first six places than last year. You had to really wrestle well to place."

"Darris (Keller) had his best two days of wrestling of the year. He lost to the Goodland wrestler who placed second but in his last four matches he had one tech fall and three pins.

"Cody (Sherlock) lost to Campbell of Oakley, who is a quality wrestler and has defeated Cody before this year. The kid from Russell was quality also. Actually the three kids who placed above Cody are outstanding wrestlers. We can always count on Cody to wrestle up to his potential.

"Grady (Brunk) lost in the semis to a kid from Ellis. When wrestling for third and fourth he got caught in a headlock and was pinned.

"It was just not Freddy's (Pacheco) day. He lost to the wrestlers who placed third and fifth.

"Jesse (Pacheco) lost his first match and in his match to metal he was ahead 8-2 but got caught in a headlock and pinned.

"Scott (Ford) was within one match of placing. The top six kids in this weight were very good.

"Adam (Guthmiller) went 1-2 for the day.

"Nathan (Lamb) is only a freshman and at this weight he was against more experienced kids. He has a good attitude.

"By the end of the year I hope as a team we are more consistent. We need to learn to get off our back and also eliminate mistakes."
