It is important to place in the top four at Garden City as that is the ticket to attend the state tournament in Topeka.

"As a first year head coach I have learned a lot about high school basketball this year," Coach Jeff Beims said.

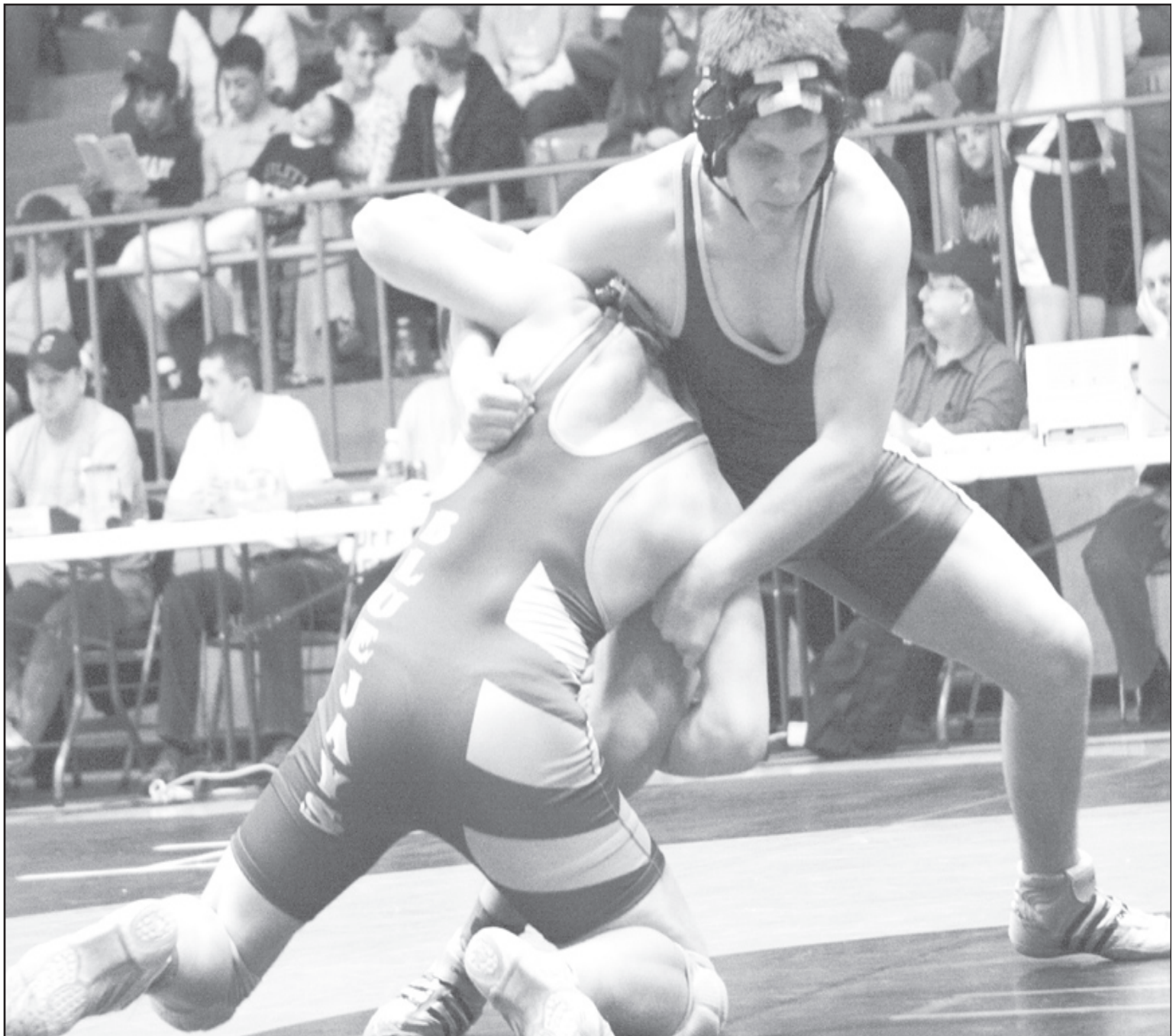

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Four seniors ended their high school basketball career in Atwood on March 2 in the first round of the Plainville substate tournament. The loss to Rawlins County that night eliminated St. Francis from post-season play.

Trent Kinen, Jacob Riedel, Ethan Zwegardt and Sam Sowers were the senior members of the squad who dressed for their last outing that night.

The Indian basketball squad finished the campaign with a 5-14 record.

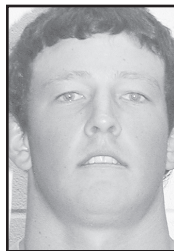
During the season, they were involved in one tournament, the Sagebrush Classic in Brewster in December. St. Francis earned the right to play in the championship game of the Sagebrush Classic by defeating Brewster and Stratton in pool play. Rawlins County, the winner of the other pool, met the Indians on Saturday night in Brewster.

When the final buzzer sounded, the Buffaloes walked away with an 86-44 victory.

Sainty met one team, Oberlin on the final day of the Oberlin Invitational in January, but they lost to the Red Devils.

The Indians are also members of the Northwest Kansas League and competed with each team in the league, Colby, Goodland, Hoxie, Oakley, Oberlin/Decatur Community, Quinter and Rawlins County during the season. They finished league play 0-7.

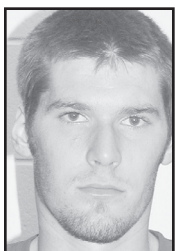
