Board wraps up fair entertainment

Cheyenne County Fair Board members, at the Thursday meeting, were preparing to wrap up entertainment for the fair set for Aug. 5-8.

Brian Hobrock, member, presented the Wednesday and Thursday night rodeo events.

Wednesday night will include the mutton bustin', barrel race and team roping. The board approved the team-roping event to be called

the Gary Grice and Carl Keller Memorial.

Thursday is the "horse-verse-horsepower" event. This is new for the fair and the board is looking forward for a good turnout.

Entries will be accepted at 6 p.m. on both nights and the performances will start at 7 p.m.

Cattle for the team roping are being donated by Butch Ewing and Harold George. Some discussion followed about having the cattle for the horse-verses-horse-

power livestock-sorting event, but the members expressed appreciation for the fact that cattle would be available for the team roping and did not want to over extend the use of the cattle.

Mr. Hobrock presented the rules for barrel racing, pole bending, livestock sorting, trailer race, and four-wheel racing, as well as the horse-verses-horsepower event. Rules were accepted.

Monster truck

The board had been presented

with a proposal from a group that will give rides on a monster truck.

In the past, the board had received proposals but did not agree with the cost of the rides, or how the insurance would be handled. However, this year the board liked what was proposed and motion carried to allow the monster truck to come to the fair.

Derby

The demolition derby is ready to go. Megan Downey, member, reported a Benkelman representative gave her a mailing list with 15 names to add to the board's demolition derby mailing list.

Colby and Goodland will be using the same rules as the Cheyenne County derby. It was discussed using a point system from all three races and having the awards given out at the Cheyenne County Fair since it was the last of the three.

Motion carried to add \$350 to the award pot with Colby and Goodland.

Fireworks

John Finley, member, mentioned speaking with Donna Stevens about an opening day fireworks display for approximately \$500.

Jared Douthit, member, suggested having the fireworks at the end of the fair during the announcements of the derby winners. Board members agreed.

Annual meeting to be in Atwood

The United States 36 Highway Association will hold its annual meeting Friday in Atwood, with members and dignitaries set to hear a report on an economic survey of the route across Kansas by experts at Fort Hays State University sponsored by the group.

A reception and social hour from 6 to 8 p.m. Thursday at the "Not a Hilton But It'll Do" motel and convention center on U.S. 36 will kick off the meeting.

Chris Sramek, Rawlins County chamber president will offer a welcome during the reception.

The meeting starts at 8 a.m. Friday with registration, followed by a welcome at 9 a.m. from Mayor Betty Mickey and the Atwood Chamber.

President Steve Haynes of Oberlin, who will be the master of ceremonies, said the association meets twice a year. The idea of the association is to promote traffic and business along the road, promote improvements to the highway and good transportation in general.

Before lunch, there will be reports from the Kansas and Missouri Departments of Transportation and

the Federal Highway Administration and discussion with some of the state legislators.

Over the lunch hour, there will be a report from Dr. Preston Gilson and Dr. Gary Brinker of the Docking Institute for Public Affairs at Fort Hays State. The institute is working on a study of the economic impact of widening and improving U.S. 36 to a four-lane expressway across the state.

The \$48,000 study is being paid for with grants of \$2,000 each sought from the 13 counties along the road and a \$30,000 grant from the Dane G. Hansen Foundation, Mr. Haynes said.

In the afternoon, the association will hold a business meeting and elect officers. Among the topics will be final fund raising for the road study.

Tickets for the luncheon are \$18 each at the door. All U.S. 36 Association members, the public in general and anyone interested in transportation issues is welcome to attend.
