

Annual trail ride scheduled Sunday

The weekend was cloudy, cold and mixed with rain and snow so the 19th Cheyenne County Trail Ride was postponed to Sunday. According to the National Weather Service's seven-day report, the highs are to be in the high 60s — good weather for a trail ride.

The time is the same — 2 p.m. sharp at the Roger Samler farm, 18 miles northwest of St. Francis. The ride will last about 2.5 hours. If weather conditions are too cold, rainy or snowy, it will be rescheduled to the following Sunday.

Gary Cooper, one of the coordinators, said this will be a ride with rough terrain but there are no water crossings. New this year after the ride will be a barbecue served from a chuck wagon. Fred Magley owns the chuck wagon and the barbecue is furnished by the 4-H horse club members.

This is the horse club's only

money-making project which is used to help buy trophies for the St. Francis show.

Those on the ride will also be able to donate to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

"Donations will be accepted for the kids who would like to saddle up but can't," said Sharon Olofson, coordinator.

Signs will be posted at various points. Directions from St. Francis: 13.4 miles north on K-27 to Road W, then 4 miles west to Road 3; turn west and drive into the yard with a new shop building.

Directions from Haigler include: 8 miles south from the Kansas/Nebraska state line on K-27 to Road W; 4 miles west to Road 3, turn west and drive into the yard.
