St. Francis volunteer firemen have had a busy year putting in a total of 655.5 hours. Not only do they put out fires but are also present at accidents, sometimes using the tools for extracting a person from a vehicle to directing traffic. In 2006, they put out 22 grass fires and made six runs to extinguish burning hay bales.
