Indians win, have eight victories

Last year Oakley defeated the Indians but on Friday night St. Francis put the Northwest Kansas League game in their win column. In a fast-moving contest played in St. Francis, the final score was 51-33.

Oakley had two low-scoring quarters which gave the Indians an advantage going into the final frame. After three, the score stood at St. Francis 34, Oakley 23. Sainty kept up the pace to score the 18-point win.

"We played very good defense all night long," Coach Ward Cassidy said. "Adam (Peter) had a tough job guarding a really good post player and Ted (Crabtree) and Mac (Frewen) really helped him out. Joel (McAtee), Ted and Levi (Weeden) controlled the boards while Adam worked on their post to keep him away. AJ (McAtee) cov-

ered a lot of ground and upset their outside shooters.

"Offensively we pushed the ball better than we have and when we got in a good set we made some very good plays. Oakley is a good defensive team."

St. Francis was 60 percent from two-point range but had trouble getting the shots from beyond the arc to fall.

Crabtree with 15 points and AJ McAtee with 12 led the scoring. Crabtree hit 6-of-7 attempts from the field while AJ McAtee was successful from the line with 4-of-4.

Sainty had 15 deflections, seven steals and 12 assists. Under the basket, they collected 29 rebounds. Joel McAtee and Weeden led in this area with nine each. The team had 37 boards compared to 30 for Oakley.

"We have the Oberlin Tournament this week," Coach Cassidy

said. "All the games will be tough. We start with last year's tournament winner in Cambridge, Neb., and they are always very good. Friday we play either Quinter or Oakley."

Oakley had the Lady Indians down 35-20 at half time and went on to earn a 64-42 Northwest Kansas League victory on Friday evening. The basketball game was played in St. Francis on a very cold, snowy night.

Megan Rice led the Sainty Ladies in scoring with 10 points. She accounted for three field goals and four free throws. She was 50 percent from two-point range (3/6) and 66.7 percent from the line (4/6).

Alecia Zimbelman had the best field goal percentage with 66.7, making 4-of-6 attempts. Lauren Ross, like Rice, hit 66.7 percent (4/6) of her free throws.

The team percentage from two-point range was 40.5 percent but they did not have a large number of attempts. Oakley had 56.1 percent, making 28-of-52.

"We didn't value the basketball in this game, especially in the first half," Coach Ted Busse said. "We had 21 turnovers at halftime. We also missed out on a lot of scoring opportunities."

Defensively Kattie Ford and

Jami Pevler each had four rebounds. Sainty had a total of 21 rebounds while Oakley managed 30.

The team had six assists and 13 steals. Ross led in steals with three and Rice in assists with two.
