# At the Game

## Wrestler wins championship at 152 pounds

The wrestling season is moving into the final month of action with many important events like Regionals and State in the near future.





One meet that draws a lot of interest is the Northwest Kansas League meet. Colby took the league title this year with 195.5 points with Goodland coming in second with 155.5. The meet was held in Hoxie on Saturday.

The St. Francis Indians placed fifth with 105.5 points.



The other Sainty wrestler was Sowers, who will be able to wrestle someone who is his weight at Phillipsburg this weekend in the junior varsity division.


