

Lady Indians compete against two good teams

Teams from Brewster and Goodland competed with the Lady Indians in basketball play this week. On Tuesday night, Brewster outscored St. Francis 60-29 in a game played on the home court. The Lady Cowboys scored a 51-33 win in Goodland on Friday night.

There are no games scheduled this week-end but the Lady Indians will be on the road next week to both Cheylin (Feb. 13) and Quinter (Feb. 16).

Fans should note that regularly scheduled home games will be coming to a close this month. Mark the school calendar for an opportunity to see the Ladies in action at least one more time this year. Scheduled are make-up games with Hoxie on Tuesday, Feb. 20, and Colby on Thursday, Feb. 22.

Brewster 60, St. Francis 29

Sainty's shooting percentage, especially from the field, was low against Brewster. They made only nine of 42 attempts from two-point range and were not successful at all from beyond the arc (0/4). Brewster's percent was 53.1 while St. Francis had a 19.6 percentage.

Alecia Zimbelman hit five field goals to account for 10 of the Sainty points. Having the best field-goal percentage was Danielle Flemming with 50 percent (1/2). At the line two players were 100 percent, Flemming hit 4-of-4 and Holly Keller 2-of-2.

No quarter had the Lady Indians achieving double figures on the scoreboard.

The rebounding was fairly close with St. Francis accounting for 32 and Brewster 29. Fourteen of the St. Francis rebounds were offensive. Megan Rice and Zimbelman each had seven boards with five other Ladies contributing.

Turnovers by both teams were 20 or above with Sainty having 26.

Goodland 51, St. Francis 33

St. Francis went from playing a school near their own size on Tuesday to playing 4A Goodland on Friday. The final score was Goodland 51, St. Francis 33.

The area in which the Sainty Ladies did the best job in this game, said Coach Ted Busse, was at the free-throw line. They came up with 11-of-17 for 72.7 percent. Again the same two players were at 100 percent with Keller being 3-of-3 and Flemming 2-of-2.

No Lady Indian managed double-figure scoring but seven players contributed two points or more.

The percentage from the field was nearly double of that in the Brewster game with 36.4 percent. Crabtree hit a three, the only one this week. Holzwarth was 100 percent from the field connecting on both of her attempts.

Goodland did their best scoring after the half-time break.

"We played hard throughout this game and competed better than we did on Tuesday night," Coach Busse said.

The team had 27 rebounds with seven of them offensive. Zimbelman had nine and Rice eight. Goodland had 16 offensive boards giving them an opportunity for a rebound shot.

Sainty had 26 turnovers in this game. "Twenty of them were in the first half," Coach Busse said.

The Sainty Ladies had eight steals and six assists.

"We were tied with a little over a minute left in the game, but were unable to capitalize," Coach Flemming said.

Each team scored 10 points in the final quarter.

From the free-throw line, the Lady Indians were 5-of-7 for 71 percent while Goodland was 10-of-19 for 53 percent.

Sainty had five offensive rebounds and 10 defensive ones for a total of 15. They also had nine turnovers, four steals and three assists.
