Sainty man arrested on charges of burglary

On Feb. 3 at approximately 1 a.m., a burglary took place at Frontier Equity in Bird City. An arrest led to other charges.

Jon Stephens, 20, St. Francis, was arrested and charged with the burglary. A search of the Stephens home resulted in items taken from the Cheyenne Bowl in April and Stephens was also charged with this burglary.

Stephens was taken to the Sherman County Bastille and released on a \$5,000 cash bond. His first court appearance was Feb. 6.

The trial has been set for March 30. Stephens was charged with burglary at the Cheyenne Bowl on April 9. He was also charged with the theft of \$2,685 in cash, two beer signs worth \$1,000 each and criminal damage to property. His first appearance on these charges will be March 8.

Stephens was also charged with 21 counts of breach of privacy, attempted unlawful and unlawful use of a financial card during the period of Dec. 29 through Feb. 3. The preliminary hearing for this charge will be March 30.
