

Students do well in assessment tests

St. Francis students recently received 74 certificates for exemplary performance, the highest category, on the Kansas Assessments that were taken last spring. A few cases were duplications in that the same student may have received certificates in more than one subject.

In general, students who received these certificates scored in the top 23 percent statewide, which is the overall average for exemplary performance in all subjects tested at all grade levels tested.

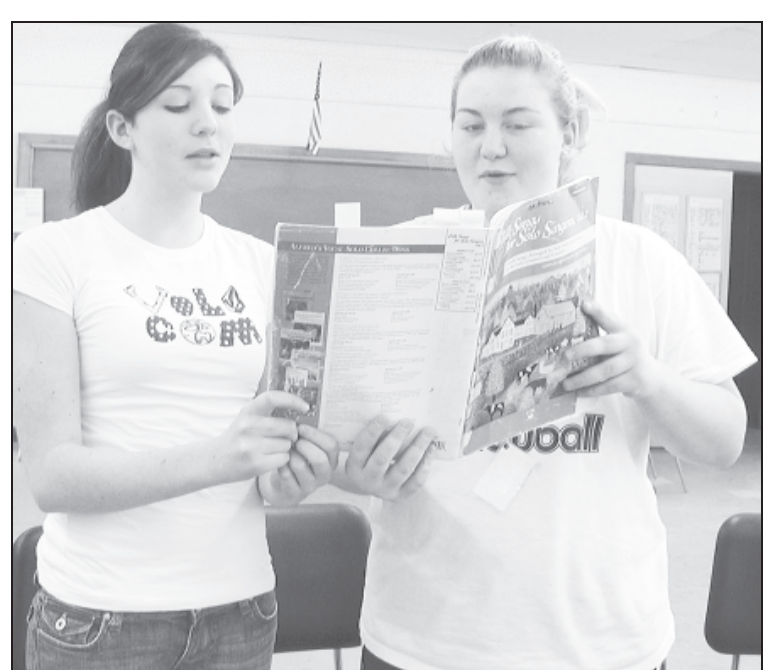
Eleven music students earn 1 ratings

Cancer relay achieves top rankings

The Relay For Life of Cheyenne County was recently recognized by the American Cancer Society for achieving top rankings in Kansas. As compared to all other Relay For Life events in northern Kansas, Relay For Life of Cheyenne County ranked first in per capita survivor participation and third in per capita income.

The event held in St. Francis raised \$25,164, which represents \$8.41 per capita. More than 58 cancer survivors walked in the opening ceremony.

"We are very proud of our Relayers in Cheyenne County," said Jennifer Van Eaton, American Cancer Society staff partner for the county. "The committee and all the volunteers worked extremely hard to make this Relay For Life event successful and this high state ranking is proof that their work paid off."

"So many people help with the Relay and contributed," Deb Lindsten, 2006 chairman, said. "People think they are not doing much but it all adds up."

Relay For Life is a fun-filled, overnight event that mobilizes communities throughout the country to celebrate survivors, remember loved ones and raise money for the fight against cancer. Teams of eight to 15 members gather with tents and sleeping bags to participate in the largest fundraising walk in the nation.

"The funds raised through our Relay For Life events enable us to continue our investment in the fight against cancer through research, education, advocacy and services to patients," Ms. Van Eaton said. "Due to the generosity of our volunteers and donors, the money raised by Relay For Life participants goes directly to

the American Cancer Society's life-saving programs."
