A quote from Florice's mother in her baby book was that the "baby was always in the best of health until Aug. 11, 1930, when she had an attack of infantile paralysis. Pee Wee graduated from St. Francis Community High School in 1944. While in high school, she worked as a babysitter for the Ted Smith family and Eddie worked at the service station for Ted. 
