"From the beginning to the end, it was an exciting game," said coach Ward Cassidy.

"The seniors who played their last game have provided a lot of exciting moments in their four years of activities.

"We were almost up to the challenge of beating Hill City on their home court. We missed several good opportunities to get a lead in the fourth quarter and allowed them to get up by eight points.

"We then pressed and made a great comeback with three steals, a lay in by Joel (McAtee) and then two three's by Levi (Weeden). There were 11 seconds left and it was a tie. We played good defense and with one second left they threw up a shot. Joel got a piece of the ball, trying for a block, and it still went in.

10 and under: Lane Hoffman, 67 pounds, participant; Shakotah Blanka, 150 pounds, third.


12 and under: Logan Lampe, 72 pounds, third; Ross Nicklos, 105 pounds, participant.
