

Food program to offer a large variety

The Prairie Land Food pak "sneak peek" for a variety of meat products in exchange for two hours of volunteer work and a minimal fee. The registration deadline is Monday, April 9 and the pickup date is Saturday, April 21, at the First Baptist Church in Saint Francis from 12:30 to 1 p.m.

The volunteer hours are on the honor system requiring no one to sign that the hours were performed. The program is not government funded so no financial or household information is required.

A feature of the program are "love offerings" that require no volunteer hours and are purchased by friends or churches for those having a rough time such as employment termination. In its second month of operation in Cheyenne County six

love offerings were made. Most requested not to be identified to the recipient.

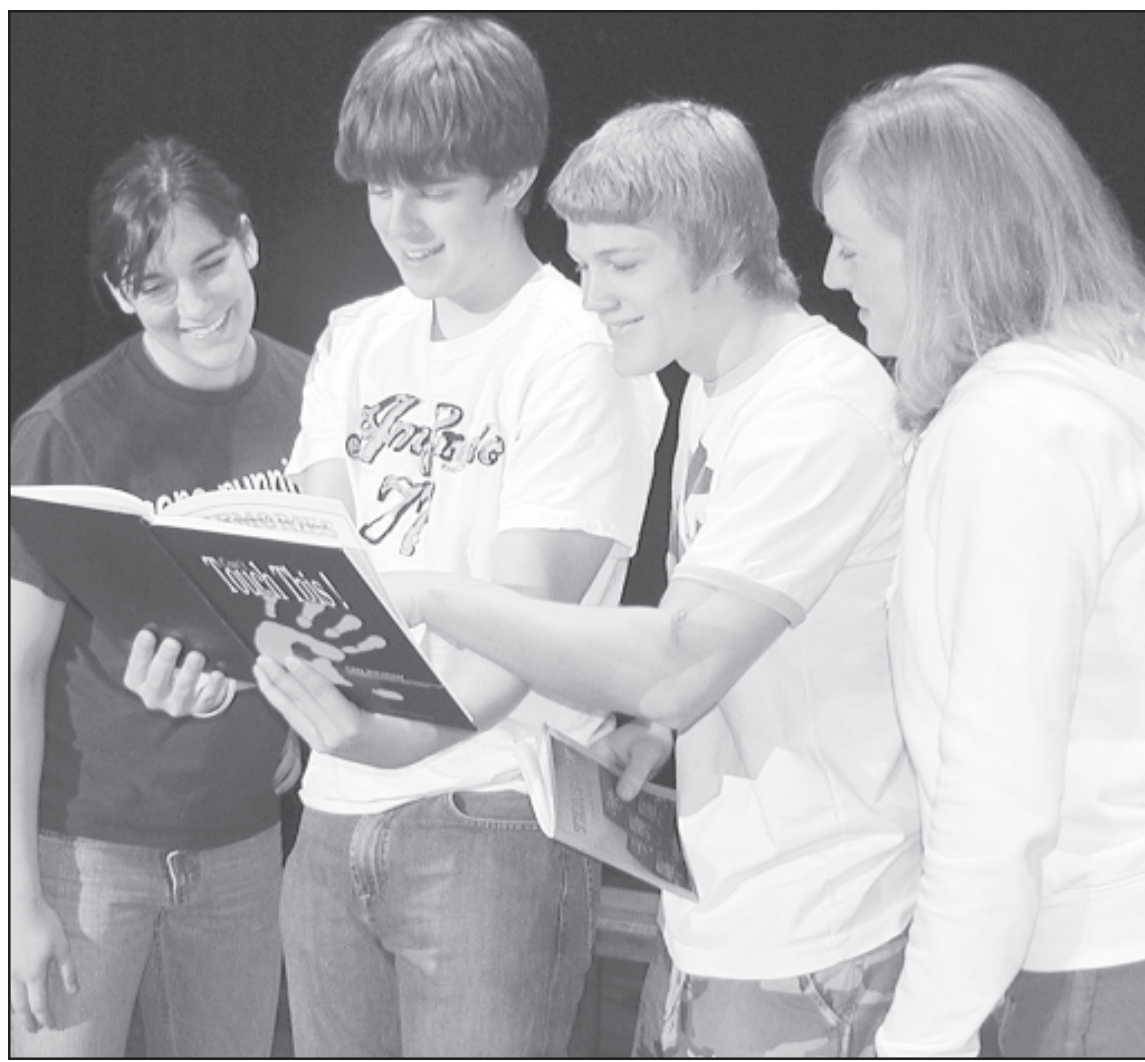
Several new registration sites have been added since the initial month of operation. The basic pak this month includes Old Carolina Bacon, BBQ hogie beef burgers, Ohse jumbo franks, center cut pork chops, Philly sandwich beef steaks, and turkey filet cutlets. Always included in basic pak all six to eight different items of fruits and vegetables. All are good quality products.

Three specials are included in the April selections. The first is the "spring fling-chicken combo: of 2 box each of breaded chicken chunks, breaded breast tenderloins, boneless/skinless breast tenderloins. The second special is the "Lil assortment combo" of two 6 oz USDA choice sirloin steaks, two 4 oz boneless pork chops, four 4-oz ground beef patties and 1 LB Italian sausage. The third special is the "little bit of Italy" of 18-oz stuffed manicotti, 18oz stuffed shells, 12-oz spinach & cheese stuffed ziti, 12-oz sun dried tomato stuffed ziti, 16-oz tri-colored tortellini, 12-oz swiss and monterey jack pierogies and 12-oz cheese ravioli. Any special may be added to the basic pak of a nominal fee and one hour of volunteer service.

March distribution was Saturday with participants double those in February. Not to be in competition with local groceries the program is designed to help the volunteer stretch their dollars at the end of the month.

February was the initial beginning of the program in Cheyenne County. It began with a big challenge from uncooperative weather when a major snow storm set in early Saturday morning. The products were picked up in Goodland on Saturday but did not make it to Saint Francis until the following day since the roads were closed to travel until Sunday.

Museum celebrates

An open house to celebrate two anniversaries will take place at the Cheyenne County Museum from 2-4 p.m. on Sunday, April 15.

The celebration honors 40 years since the society's organizational meeting in January 1967 and the first meeting in the Museum on March 8, 1987, 20 years ago.

The open house is to show appreciation for all who have built and sustained the Museum and the Historical Society.

During the afternoon, guests can tour the museum; view scrapbooks compiled by Betty Lampe, documenting the history of the museum in photos; and receive a brochure which gives a brief history of the museum and society.

Margaret Bucholtz will be recognized as the new director of the museum.

All volunteers, past and present, who attend will receive a form to fill out so they can "tell the story" of their involvement with the Historical Society and/or museum. The forms will be compiled into an ongoing Recognition Notebook. Class to perform two plays

The St. Francis Community High School Drama class has undertaken the presentation of two plays, "Three Doors to Death" and "Yearbook." The plays will be performed on Saturday, April 14, and Sunday, April 15, in the auditorium. The times will be at 7 p.m. on Saturday, and 3 p.m. for the Sunday matinee.

"Three Doors to Death" is a murder mystery and the audience gets

to decide which way the action will go and who killed Gordon Forrest. The unpopular Forrest (Russell Rogers) is mysteriously murdered during a rehearsal of an old British thriller, "Three Doors to Death." Will the killer go to jail or be allowed to escape. The audience will decide.

"Yearbook" is a positive play about the humor, determination and

care that exists in every school. Susan (Megan Rice) and Beth (Alecia Zimbelman) enlist the help of Jack (Nathan Ketzner) and Eric (Jordan Gienger) to move the boxes of hot-off-the-press yearbooks that just arrived. Between loads, they stop to flip through the pages, reminiscing through flashback scenes about the year's highlights.

"It is our hope that the audience and student actors will thrive on its positive message about teens and will feel renewed hope for the future," said David Morrow, one of the directors.

The plays are directed by David and Talley Morrow with assistant student director Janelle Zweygardt.


