Farm machinery stolen from property

Farm machinery belonging to Sam Goodale was stolen from a building southeast of Wheeler between Dec. 4 and March 16.

It was a long winter. A couple of weeks ago, Mr. Goodale's son went to the building to get some tools and noticed that some of the equipment was missing. Mr. Goodale went to check and, sure enough, most of the equipment was gone. That equipment included an Allis Chalmers 8070 tractor valued at \$20,000; a 930 Case propane tractor, \$5,000; and a GMC truck, \$3,000; a total of \$28,000.

The building is located on Roads 20 and I and there is just a path going to it from the road. Mr. Goodale said that the building can be seen from K-27 and he always checked (from the highway) to see

if the doors were open (which they were not). Since the snow storms until recently, the path was covered with snow and there was no evidence that someone had been there.

"It (the burglary) had to have been before it started snowing," Mr. Goodale said.

Mr. Goodale said he and his dad, Max, had always kept their machinery stored in the shed. Max had purchased the 930 Case and Sam was keeping it so his grandchildren could drive it in the parade someday.

None of the equipment was insured.

Cheyenne County Sheriff officers were on the scene looking for clues and reported that the case is still under investigation.


