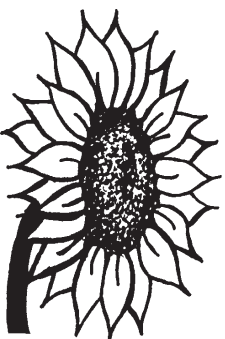

Several Saintry tracksters place first

St. Francis opened the track season at home on Thursday, March 29, with a quadrangular meet. Athletes from Sharon Springs, Burlington and Wray provided the competition.

The Indian boys were just one point away from earning first place as they had 72 points to 73 for Burlington. Saintry tracksters came in first in five of the 15 individual events. Wray placed third and Sharon Springs, fourth.

Sharon Springs outdistanced the other three teams in the girls division with 83 points. Wray had 69 points for second place, Saintry had 59 points for third and Burlington 48 fourth. Again, just like in the

boys division, the Lady Indians placed first in five events.

Saintry individuals who placed first in at least one event include: Levi Weeden in the shot put with 43-3, the discus with 133-7 and the javelin with 150-9; Ted Crabtree in the high jump with 5-10 and in the pole vault with 12-6; Holly Keller in the 110 hurdles with 18.15; Megan Rice in the 300 hurdles with 52.8; Lauren Ross in the pole vault with 8-6; and Sidnee Crabtree in the shot put with 34.11.5 and in the discus with 98-1.

Spring break is over and the two-day Easter vacation will take place this weekend. After that, the squads will have the opportunity for some concentrated practice sessions when they are not busy with scheduled meets.

Fort Hays State University Alex Francis Classic
