

Animals are like people in that they are emotionally affected by disasters. Often violent impacts of disaster disorient and temporarily alter the behavioral state of liveanimals, realize that they may be upset, confused and agitated. They need help finding their normal be-

Here are some proven techniques for doing this:

- 1. Handle livestock quietly, calmly and in a manner they are fa-
- 2. Wear clothing and use vehicles that are familiar to them.
- 3. If possible, keep or reunite fa-
- 4. As soon as possible, place them in familiar settings or one which is quiet, calm and insulated from additional stimuli.
- 5. Soft music and familiar sounds
- 6. If possible, clean the animals Readers may submit questions by (i.e., wipe out their eyes, mouths and nostrils).
 - 7. If possible, move animals
 - 8. Treat wounds of injured animals so their comfort level im-


