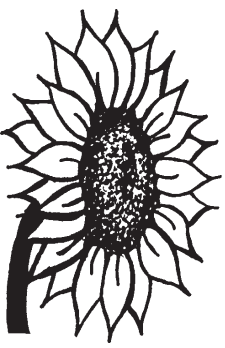

Athletes compete at Dundy County

St. Francis tracksters were among athletes from nine area high schools who participated in the Dundy County Invitational on Tuesday, April 3.

Both St. Francis teams finished in fifth place and both had a total of 62 points for the day. The boys' division was won by Dundy County with 105 points while Cambridge placed first in the girls' division with 106.5 points. The Cambridge girls were 27.5 points ahead of the second place finisher, Hitchcock County with 79 points.

In the girls' 4x100 relay, the St. Francis team of Megan Rice, Katie Marin, Elizabeth Gienger and Jami Pevler placed first with a time of 55.10.

Individually Levi Weeden placed first in the discus with a throw of 144-01. He also won the discus in the quad the week before. His toss at that time was 133-7.

Lauren Ross moved her pole vault leap to 9-0 at Benkelman. She earned a second place. Last week

she reached 8-6 but with less schools involved placed first.

Ted Crabtree again won the pole vault in the boys division. He reached 12-6 in both the invitational and in the quad.

Other second place finishers for the Indians and Lady Indians besides Ross in the pole vault were the girls' 4x400-meter relay team (Melissa Burton, Rice, Ross and Gienger) and Sidnee Crabtree in the girls' shot put.

Results of the Hoxie Invitational, scheduled for Friday will be published next week.
